# President's Report

#### Spring 2024 - President's Report

Spring is right around the corner!

I live along a river that is extremely popular with ice fishermen. Every year a small town of fishing shacks is set up. The shacks must be removed by a certain date as an amphibex comes along and breaks up all the ice in anticipation of the spring thaw. That's what always signals 'spring' to me. This year everything is over a week early! A question was asked regarding what CNASA plans to do about tails and the breed standard. The standard already accepts natural tails, whether they be full length, or some degree of bob tail.

"The tail may be docked, bobtailed, or naturally long." CNASA will NOT be adding a description of the tail or tail carriage. There is already a description of the croup. "The croup is moderately sloping, the ideal being 30° from the horizontal."

If a dog has the correct slope of croup, generally the tail will follow. The flat croups that were popular for quite a while because they added a very flashy kick back in the rear leg movement, may now cause high set tails that are carried over the back. Judges that disregarded the correct croup in the past, may now pay more attention when they see high tails.

Adding a description of the tail is a HUGE undertaking. We are not even totally sure what a correct tail in an Aussie looks like. We have had decades and decades of docked tails. It would mean looking at the description of the croup, describing tail set, and describing tail carriage. And all of that for multiple tail lengths! This would be a huge undertaking for ASCA's Conformation Committee, which is filled with experts on structure, never mind our little Canadian club. We have always been very careful when addressing the standard not to add faults to a standard that list very few.

Movement is something that is addressed quite clearly in our standard, yet we still see judges rewarding dogs that don't converge properly on the down and back. A non-converging front is a very serious soundness issue in our breed. Dirty rears that interfere when the dog is traveling away are also a soundness issue. I'm not sure that everyone even knows what clean down and backs look like?

Every show I go to, I sit ringside all day long. I find the corner of the down and back and watch the judging. This last show in Brandon, I sat and watched 6 shows. All the groups. How are people learning when they're not watching rings??? The absolute best way to learn is to sit with someone more experienced and judge the dogs as they are shown. Comment on clean fronts, comment on dirty rears, look at the toplines, look at the side - and I'm talking in ALL breeds! There is so much to learn by watching other breeds! If you like a dog, justify why. If you don't like a dog, justify why. Do your placements match the judge? It's okay if they don't always match, different people put more weight on different aspects of the standard. Speaking of standards – I have my phone with me and when we're watching labs, I pull up the lab standard, same deal if I'm watching chihuahuas. If your picks are consistently not jiving with the judge, find a mentor and watch a bit with them. They may be able to add some clarity for you.

The other thing you can see when you sit and watch ringside is handling. You can see who didn't watch the dog before them and doesn't know the judge's pattern (annoying!). You can see who is fidgeting with their dog while the judge waits and waits. You can see who is going too fast, or too slow, for their dog. And some handlers you don't see at all, your eyes just go to the dog – that should be your goal.

The best part about dog shows is the company we keep. Brandon shows are particularly enjoyable for me because we all descend on Shannon Cole's house, and talk dogs and life, all night long. If you don't have those trusted dog friends, shows are a very lonely place, and people don't stay in the sport very long.

It was also nice to see a show with such a large obedience and rally entry. They reached their limit and had a waiting list. Some beautiful Aussies working and winning!!

Forecast now says a big winter storm over the weekend. So much for my early spring!




