## GENERAL RULES FOR ROSE AND PEONY SHOW 2024

1. Exhibiting is open to all. Non-members* of THS\&GC will be charged an exhibitor's fee of fifteen dollars for 2024, this includes your ticket for the speaker during the afternoon.
2. Number of Entries per class:

Horticultural Division is not limited per class, unless otherwise stated. They must be different varieties/cultivars.
Design Division is limited to 1 per class.
3. Naming your Exhibit:

We would appreciate the names of all the varieties/cultivars to be written on the exhibit tags for the educational value, if possible.
4. All exhibitors must register at the show hall before placing their exhibits.
5. All exhibits must be in the show hall between 9am and 11am and remain in place until the end of the show. Judging starts at 11:15am.
6. Judging will be based on the Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards; Second Edition 2019. The judge will be OHA accredited. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases. Any protest must be in writing and submitted to the Show Chair. No prize will be given if the exhibit is not worthy.
7. Exhibitors must furnish their own containers and remove them after the show. The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to containers.
8. All exhibits for the Horticulture Division must be strictly amateur and must be grown by the exhibitor. No strings or wires permitted in the Horticultural Division.
9. Exhibits for the Design Division may be acquired from sources other than the designer's own garden, unless specifically stated in class description. The designer must be an amateur. 10. Entry tags will be provided by the Society. These can be acquired in advance of the show day by contacting the Show Chair.
11. There are only 4 exhibits allowed in Class 59 - English Box. You must pre-register to secure your spot. You must find a substitute exhibitor if you cannot fulfil this commitment.
12. The show will be free to attend from 3 to 5 pm .
13. The speaker presentation will begin at $3: 30$ and there will be a $\$ 15$ fee for non-members of THS\&GC. Members and our guest exhibitors are free to attend.

## PRIZES AND AWARDS

Best of Show rosette - Chosen by the judge, from the design or horticulture divisions.
Best of Design rosette - Chosen by the judge, from the design classes.
Best of Horticulture rosette - Chosen by the judge, from the horticulture classes
Best Peony rosette - Chosen by the judge, from the horticulture classes
Best Rose rosette - Chosen by the judge, from the horticulture classes

TROPHY - Queen of the Show - est. 2023, Donated by the Kimmerly Family. Awarded to the THS \& GC member with the most points in the Rose Classes (5 points for 1st place, 3 points for 2 nd place, 2 points for 3 rd place, 1 point for Honourable Mention)

## HORTICULTURE DIVISION

SECTION A - FLOWERING BULBS, CORMS, RHIZOMES AND TUBERS named if possible

Class 1 - Allium, blossom less than 4" across - 1 scape
Class 2 - Allium, blossom greater than $4 "$ and less than $8 "-1$ scape
Class 3 - Allium, blossom greater than $8 "-1$ scape
Class 4 - Iris,Bearded - all one colour, or tone, 1 spike
Class 5 - Iris,Bearded - falls and standards, two different colours, 1 spike
Class 6 - Iris,Bearded - colours blended, splashed, or streaked, 1 spike
Class 7 - Iris,Beardless e.g. Japanese, Siberian - 1 spike
Class 8 - Iris,Bulbous e.g., English, Spanish, Dutch - 1 scape
Class 9 -LILIUM - 1 stem
Class10-ANY OTHER FLOWERING bulb, corm, rhizome or tuber - 1 scape, spike, stem, named

## SECTION B-PEONY named if possible

Class 11 - Double/Semi - white, yellow or blends -1 bloom

Class 12 - Double/Semi - Pinks, reds or blends -1 bloom
Class 13 - Double/Semi - Apricots, oranges or blends -1 bloom
Class 14 - Double/Semi - Any other colour not mentioned above - 1 bloom
Class 15 - Single - 1 bloom
Class 16 - Anemone, Japanese or Tree - 1 bloom
Class 17 - Collection - 3-5 different cultivars, 1 stem each

## SECTION C - PERENNIALS / SHRUBS

Class 18 - ASTILBE - 1 spray, with foliage
Class 19 - COREOPSIS - 3 blooms, same cultivar
Class 20 - DELPHINIUM - 1stalk, any variety
Class 21 - FERNS - 3 fronds, same cultivar
Class 22-GERANIUM (Cranesbill) - 3 leaves, same cultivar
Class 23 - HEMEROCALLIS (daylily) - 1 scape
Class 24 - HEUCHERA(coral bells), HEUCHERELLA, TIARELLA - 3 flower sprays, and 3
leaves of the same cultivar
Class 25 - HEUCHERA(coral bells), HEUCHERELLA, TIARELLA - 3 leaves, different cultivars/varieties
Class 26 - HOSTA, solid colour - giant(120 sq in or more), 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 27 - HOSTA, solid colour - large( 64 sq in < 120), 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 28 - HOSTA, solid colour - medium ( 30 sq in to $<64$ ), 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 29 - HOSTA, solid colour - small( 6 sq in to < 30), 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 30 - HOSTA, solid colour - miniature ( $<6 \mathrm{sq} \mathrm{in}$ ), 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 31 - HOSTA, variegated - giant, 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 32 - HOSTA, variegated - large, 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 33 - HOSTA, variegated - medium, 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 34 - HOSTA, variegated - small, 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 35 -HOSTA, variegated - miniature, 3 leaves of the same cultivar
Class 36 - HOSTA - 3 to 5 different cultivars, 1 leaf each, named
Class 37 - ANY OTHER FLOWERING PERENNIAL - 3 blooms, 3 spikes or 3 stems, same cultivar, named
Class 38 - ANY OTHER FOLIAGE PERENNIAL - 3 leaves of the same cultivar, named Class 39 - ANY FLOWERING OR FRUITING, BRANCH OR VINE, length not to exceed 24" from the rim of the vase (excluding roses) - 1 branch, named

## SECTION D - ROSES with foliage attached, named if possible

## Large Flowered Roses(Hybrid Tea) disbudded

Class 40-1 specimen bloom - white, yellow, or yellow blend
Class 41-1 specimen bloom - pink, pink blend, red or red blend
Class 42-1 specimen bloom - apricot, apricot blend, orange or orange blend
Class 43-1 specimen bloom - any other colour

Class 44 - Cycle of Bloom - 3 blooms( 1 fully opened, 1 exhibition stage, 1 bud) in single container, the fully open bloom nearest the front and the bud at the back, same cultivar Class 45 - Collection of Hybrid Teas - 1 stem each, different cultivars, minimum 3

## Sprays of Cluster Flowers( Floribunda, Grandiflora, Climbers, Austins, Canadian, Shrubs)

Class 46 - Floribunda, 1 spray - white, yellow or yellow blend
Class 47 - Floribunda, 1 spray - pink, pink blend, red or red blend
Class 48 - Floribunda, 1 spray - apricot, apricot blend, orange, or orange blend
Class 49 - Floribunda, 1 spray - any other colour
Class 50 - Grandiflora, 1 spray - any colour
Class 51 - Climbing Rose, 1 spray - any colour
Class 52 - Austin Rose, 1 spray - any colour
Class 53 - Canadian Hybridized Rose, 1 spray - any cultivar, any colour
(i.e. Explorer Series, Parkland Series, 49th Parallel Series)

Class 54 - Old Garden Roses(Cultivated pre 1867), 1 spray or bloom - any cultivar, any colour
Class 55 - Any Other Shrub, 1 spray - not already listed, any colour, any cultivar
Class 56 - Collection of Clusters, 3 sprays - in separate vessels, different cultivars
Class 57 - Floating Rose in Bowl, 1 bloom - floating in bowl, fully open, no foliage, any cultivar, including Hybrid Teas
Class 58 - Fragrant Rose, 1 spray or bloom - any cultivar, including Hybrid Teas

## Class 59 Exhibitors are limited to 1 exhibit

Class 59 - English Box, six blooms - without foliage, no more than 2 specimens of 1 cultivar, including Hybrid Teas

## Miniature Roses

Class 60-1 specimen bloom - white, yellow, or yellow blend
Class 61-1 specimen bloom - pink, pink blend, red or red blend
Class 62-1 specimen bloom - apricot, apricot blend, orange or orange blend
Class 63-1 specimen bloom - any other colour
Class 64 - Collection of 3 miniature specimens - different cultivars
Class 65-1 spray - white, yellow or yellow blend
Class 66-1 spray - pink, pink blend, red or red blend
Class 67-1 spray - apricot, apricot blend, orange, or orange blend
Class 68-1 spray - any other colour

## SECTION E - HERBS/FRUITS/VEGETABLES named

Class 69 - Herbs - 3 stems in vase, same cultivar
Class 70 - Herbs - 3 stems in vase, different cultivars
Class 71 - Lettuce, leaf - 3 leaves in container of water, any mix of cultivars
Class 72 - Onions, green - 5 stems, trimmed (leaves $6 "-8 "$ and roots $1 / 2 "$ )
Class 73 - Radish - 3 , trimmed (tops $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ but roots left on) same cultivar
Class 74 - Rhubarb, pulled(not cut) - 3 stalks, leaves trimmed(2")
Class 75 - Strawberries - 5, with calyx
Class 76 - Any other fruit/vegetable - 3 specimens for each cultivar

## RULES FOR DESIGN

1. All plant material used in design classes may be newly acquired unless otherwise stated.
2. An accessory is permitted to complete the design or develop the theme unless otherwise stated; it must be to scale.
3. All designs must include a part or whole of a rose and/or peony, unless otherwise stated.
4. We will allot a space of 20 " square for each design, except class $77^{*}$
5. There will be no limit on height except where stated.
6. A well-proportioned design will fill a maximum of $2 / 3$ to $3 / 4$ of the allotted space.
7. Exhibitors limited to one entry per class.
8. Refer to hints and definitions for help in achieving the design requirements. This is a separate document found on our web site.

## SECTION F

Class 77 - Father of the Bride - representation of the MONEY TREE you have plucked to pay for this affair, MEN ONLY * No size restrictions.

Class 78 - Bride's Bouquet - hand-tied design (to be kept fresh in water)
Class 79 - Flower Girl's Basket - flowers from your own garden, basket to be no greater than 6 "x6" (the rose and peony rule is exempt for this class)

Class 80 - Teacup Shower - a small design in a tea cup
Class 81 - \$300 Place Setting! - dining table centrepiece, horizontal design, NOVICE ONLY
Class 82 - Decadence - Tall centrepiece for the dessert table, a design
