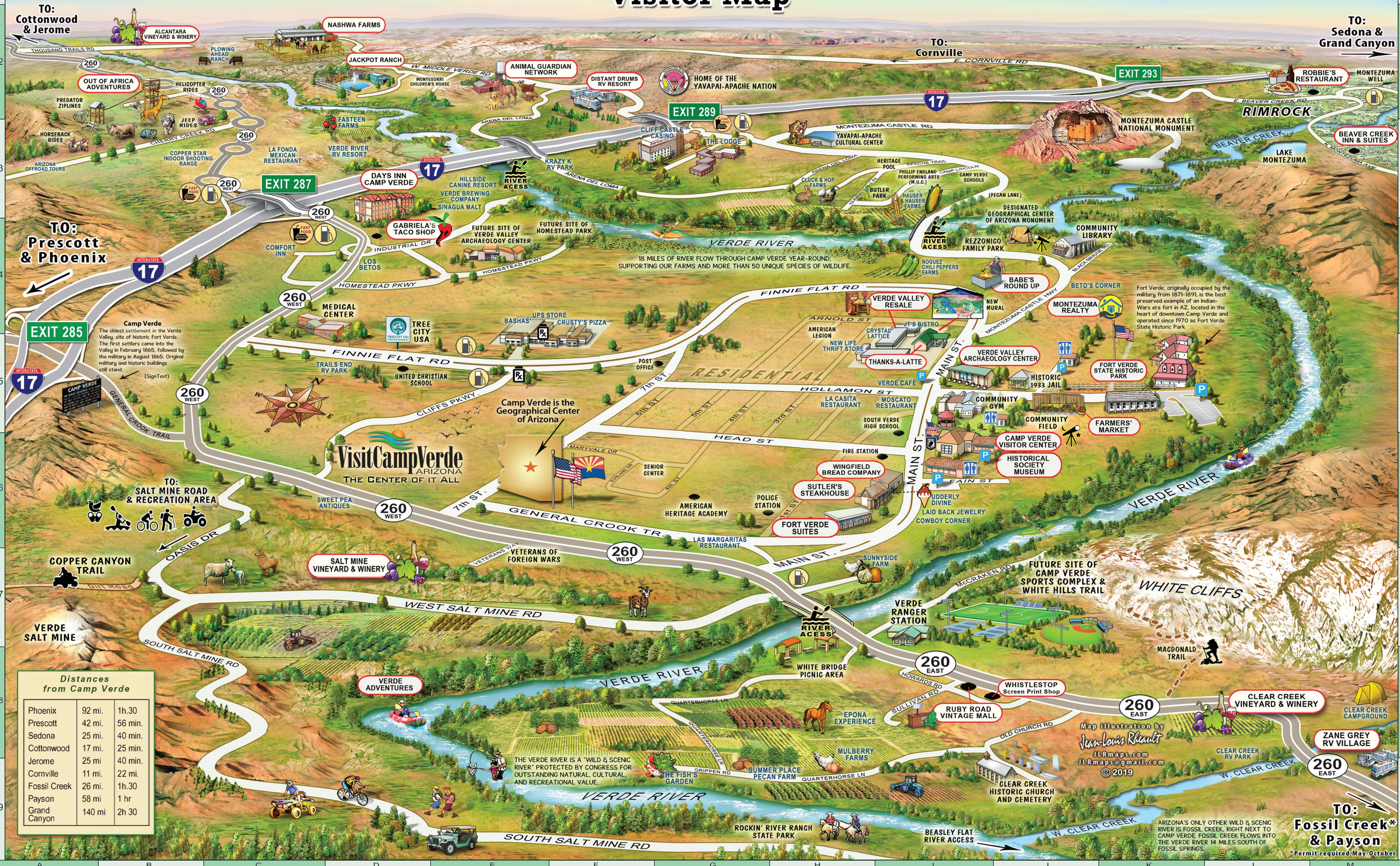

Camp Verde
The oldest settlement in the Verde Valley, site of historic Fort Verde. The first settlers came into the Valley in February 1865, followed by the military in August 1865. Original military and historic buildings still stand.

THE VERDE RIVER IS A "WILD & SCENIC RIVER" PROTECTED BY CONGRESS FOR OUTSTANDING NATURAL, CULTURAL, AND RECREATIONAL VALUE.

Fort Verde, originally occupied by the military from 1871-1891, is the best preserved example of an Indian-Wars era fort in AZ, located in the heart of downtown Camp Verde and operated since 1970 as Fort Verde State Historic Park

ARIZONA'S ONLY OTHER WILD & SCENIC RIVER IS FOSSIL CREEK, RIGHT NEXT TO CAMP VERDE. FOSSIL CREEK FLOWS INTO THE VERDE RIVER 14 MILES SOUTH OF FOSSIL SPRINGS.
