Dear Parents.

Our class is participating in the Lucky Dog- Humane Education curriculum that teaches kindness, respect, compassion, and responsibility. Research has shown that teaching young children from an early age to participate in community service and empathize with others can greatly reduce the risk of developing bully like characteristics.

This month's lesson begins with the book <u>Make Way for Ducklings</u> by Robert McCloskey. The book helps teach the importance of respecting our community wildlife or "urban wildlife" such as ducks, squirrels, birds, and opossums. The lesson focuses on being a responsible citizen, keeping our community clean, keeping a safe and respectful distance from wildlife, and speaking up if you see cruelty or disrespect. We will be taking a wildlife walk, and following writing prompts to write about what respect means to us.

They will then report their findings by creating an informative poster, making a video, or creating a diorama of that animal's habitat.
