Lucky Dog Humane Education –Kindness Writing Prompt

OBJECTIVE: To inspire children to feel empathy and compassion for animals and all living creatures through a simple follow up writing activity. Children will develop vocabulary and writing skills while they critically think of ways they can treat themselves and others with kindness.

PREPARATION: Students will meet a PAWFESSOR that has survived trauma/abuse or read the story Buddy Unchained by Daisy Bix and participate an interactive session on being kind, helping others, and speaking out when we see bullying or cruelty. This gives students basic knowledge of being kind, being a trustworthy friend, being a responsible citizen and doing their part in stopping cruelty and neglect.

IMPLEMENTATION:

After meeting a PAWfessor who has survived cruelty or listening to the story of Buddy Unchained and discussing scenarios of cruelty the children will be given the following writing prompt:

Write a Letter to a dog that has survived Cruelty and tell them:

- · Why you promise to be kind and never be cruel
- Why kindness is important to you
- Ways you are/will be kind to your pets
- Ways you are/will be kind to stray animals
- Ways you are/will be kind to your friends
- Ways you will be kind to a new student at your school or a classmate that you don't know well
- Tell them how meeting them empowered you to do your part to stop bullying and spread kindness

Materials: Pencil, paper, crayons or markers for illustrations

Concepts: Building Character, helping children think about ways to be kind and ways to make a difference.

CONCLUSION: Give children an opportunity to share their letters before sending them. Lucky Dog Humane Educators will collect letters to mail to the Pawfessor they wrote to.
