

Realistic Animal Shelter for Older Grades

- Look up your local animal shelter website
- Print pictures of adoptable shelter dogs (and other pets)
- Students research each pet's needs
- Students write a adoption biography for each pet (each student may choose 1 pet or class can discuss and collaborate on the write-ups)
- See sample write up below

Stress to students that when adopting a pet that a family needs to do research and make sure that they can meet that pet's needs for life. Also make sure students know that if their family is not ready for the commitment that they need to respect their parent/guardians decision, and even thank them for waiting which is the responsible choice to make.
