

Board Of Supervisors Regular Meeting Minutes

May 22nd, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. at the Bagley USDA Service Center. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Agenda: The agenda was reviewed by the board. Christenson made the motion to approve the agenda as is. Second, by Sloan. **Motion carried 4-0.**

Rydeen arrived at 10:07

Minutes: Minutes of the April meeting were reviewed by the board. Lewis made the motion to approve the minutes. Seconded by Gunvalson. **Motion carried 5-0.**

NRCS REPORT:

Current and Future Funding: Brandt explained that existing and potential Inflation Reduction Act funds are being reviewed. Current selected IRA applications for EQIP 2025 were on hold, of Clearwater's 6 applications 5 were IRA's. Brandt explained that future funding levels were still unclear.

RCPP-American Bird Conservancy: Brandt noted there was one application in Clearwater County and to let him know if there was any interest.

EQIP: Brandt was working on selections with 2 so far in Clearwater County.

CSP: Brandt noted ranking deadline was March 14th and Clearwater County had 3 selected for funding.

Staffing: Brandt noted there will be lots of internal shuffling.

Upcoming Events: Brandt attended the Local Workgroup Meeting last month and attended Envirothon on 5/7.

PROGRAM TECHNICIAN REPORT

Education Outreach: Prokosch reported that she has been continuously working on the district website and facebook keeping the public updated on multiple programs/events.

Prokosch attended Watch 'em Grow with Clearbrook first graders on 5/13 and Bagley on 5/14.

Water Plan: Prokosch reported she has been entering rain gauge.

Prokosch noted the 2025 SWAG lake monitoring started next week with Clearwater County's regular lake monitoring season starting normally in June.

Trees: Prokosch noted tree pick up days were 5/1-5/3. Prokosch noted 131 tree orders were made 70% of preordered trees being sold. There were 8 orders of flowers sold as well. During tree pick up days and the following week 90% of all trees were sold during a sale of the leftover trees. The rest of the trees were donated to the schools on 5/20.

AIS: Prokosch noted the watercraft inspector season started on 5/9 with inspectors picking up their equipment the week before.

DISTRICT TECHNICIAN REPORT

Buesing did not attend the May meeting.

WATER PLAN COORDINATOR/TECHNICIAN REPORT

Soil Health: Powell noted the no-till drills had finished maintenance and repairs for them to be out and running. Powell noted that Churness had completed 63 acres for and 1 soil test for \$2,545 of cost share, Overby completed 85 acres for \$3,400, Faldet completed 60 acres for \$2,400, Sunquist completed 21 acres for \$840, Peterson completed 55 acres and 1 soil test for \$2,2225, Nordlund completed 35 acres for \$490 and Nelson completed 104 acres for \$4,160 to be taken out of Clearwater 1W1P funds and/or soil health expansion funds.

Forest Stewardship: Powell noted Davies had completed a plan on 40 acres for \$900 in for 75% cost share out of Wild Rice 1W1P. Christenson mad ethe motion to approve cost share for Davies. Seconded by Lewis. **Motion carried 5-0.** Ricke for 92 acres for \$984 cost share out of increase compacity funds. Sloan made the motion to approve the cost share. Seconded by Lewis. **Motion carried 5-0.**

Cost Share: Powell noted Benson needed approval on a well sealing contract. Lewis mad ethe motion to approve the contract. Seconded by Sloan. **Motion carried 5-0.**

Powell noted Beardsley completed a well sealing for \$457.50 for 50% cost share. Lewis made the motion to approve the cost share. Seconded by Gunvalson. **Motion carried 5-0.**

Trees: Powell noted tree pick up days were 5/1-5/3. Powell planted trees for Koep, Dewey, Gunvalson, and Imle.

Education Outreach: Powell attended Watch 'em Grow with Clearbrook first graders on 5/13 and Bagley on 5/14 and Envirothon on 5/7.
