2021 Tree Sale

Once again, it's time to start thinking about ordering trees for next year!

Each year we sell a variety of native conifers, shrubs, fruiting and deciduous trees. We also offer Orchard, Bird & Grouse, Jam & Jelly and Shoreline packs for variety.

Our bare root trees are typically 1-2 feet in height and are locally grown in Minnesota. All species come in bundles of 25 and range from \$15 to \$30 per bundle.

We will start accepting order forms January 2021. Please mail in (preferred due to COVID-19) or drop off your order form at the office. A check or cash value of your total amount is expected with your order form. Be sure to provide your email and phone number so we may inform you of any reminders or changes. There is no deadline to turn in the order form, but it is *first come*, *first served*. In addition, our car pick-up went so smoothly this year that we'll probably do the same thing next year as well!

Ag Spray Sprayer

New Soil Health Equipment for Rent!

We recently purchased a new pull-behind Ag Spray Sprayer this year for all your herbicide and fertilizing needs! Our Sprayer can hold up to 350 gallons and has a ~35-foot spray width. It is light enough to be pulled by a 600cc ATV. You can rent the Sprayer for \$7 per acre with a minimum charge of \$70. The Sprayer is not available for cost-share.

We also have our No-Till Drill available for rent for \$14 per ace with a minimum charge of \$140 and our Aerator available for rent for \$10 per acre with a minimum charge of \$100. Both may be eligible for cost-share depending on your location.

As always, with all our soil health equipment, the Clearwater SWCD staff will provide hands on guidance and help with any questions. We will deliver our equipment to you and pick it up as well! Give us a call next spring to ask about renting any of our soil health equipment.









New Happenings at the Conservation Farm

First a timber sale...

Then a day use area!

After completing a timber sale to promote new forest growth on the South side of the conservation farm. Clearwater SWCD has decided to make some vast improvements to encourage the public to visit. We have decided to create a Day Use and Parking area and have already started construction for a parking lot located on the north side of the property roughly 800 feet East of the original driveway. Eventually the driveway will be closed to public vehicles, but we invite you to walk the driveway to visit the nearly 25-acre pollinator plot to smell the native flowers and watch the butterflies, bees and other pollinating insects. We also plan to redesign our trail system, especially on the South side of the farm. We hope to better our trails to connect to our new parking lot and take you to see the sights of the conservation farm. We plan to plant native trees next spring

and summer and perhaps even another orchard to nurture wildlife.

Did you know you can hunt on the conservation farm? Simply stop by our office in Bagley to fill out a permit for you and your fellow hunters this hunting season. We just ask that you follow our rules while hunting on the property which includes no motorized vehicles of any kind, no alcohol, no permanent deer stands, no camping and to keep out of all buildings. If you feel comfortable please feel free to send any photos to us to get the chance to appear here in our newsletter!

The conservation farm was established in 1994. The Soil and Water Conservation District's mandate in the acquisition and operation of the Conservation Farm is to protect and enhance soil and water resources, provide youth and adult resource education projects, conduct wildlife management activities and demonstrate forest management and agricultural demonstration projects. Over the years our activities on the farm have included hybrid poplar plantings, several wetland restorations, test plots for special conservation plant materials, wood duck and blue-bird houses, native species tree plantings, pollinator plots and a native orchard to name a few. The farm currently boasts roughly 5 miles of walking trails. We welcome all hikers, cross-country skiers, hunters and educational groups to visit and enjoy the farm!

2020 Envirothon

The 2020 Envirothon has been canceled

Due to COVID-19 the 2020 area 8 Envirothon has been cancelled. The 2021 Envirothon, for now, is expected to proceed as usual.

Envirothon is an environmental and natural resource conservation problem-solving, teambuilding and leadership annual event for high school students (grades 9-12) to incorporate STEM principles, experiential learning and hands-on outdoor field experiences. Clearwater River 1 Watershed 1 Plan

Clearwater River 1W1P is in its beginning stages by Chester Powell

The trend to manage water on a watershed level versus the judicial level will continue in Clearwater County as we have begun the planning process for our third and final plan. The Clearwater River Watershed that covers six counties, Red Lake Reservation and is part of the Red Lake Watershed Districts coverage. In June of 2020 the water planning members from each of these local government units submitted to the state of Minnesota a request for funding for the planning process. In August the group was excited to learn we have been awarded a planning grant in our requested amount. The group is currently collaborating and completing the necessary next steps to receive our granted funding and begin the planning process that will



continue for the next 18 to 24 months. During this time the planning group will be holding outreach events where we ask the public to participate and inform the group on water related topics. We look forward to working with everyone to manage this pristine watershed.

Office Hours

Clearwater County Rain Gauge




