School-Based Mentoring

Program Overview

The School-Based Mentoring program follows a one-to-one model, where mentors support ten referred "target" students academically, emotionally, and socially to foster their overall well-being.

Role of the Mentor

The Mentor is a part-time, paid staff member who provides support in the school environment, both inside and outside the classroom. They help create a safe, consistent space where students feel seen and supported. Mentors build trusting relationships through activities like art, writing, games, journaling, walks, or simply sitting and talking. They may also participate in in- and after-school programming to further assist students. The Partners Program Manager provides mentors with comprehensive training and ongoing support, ensuring they have the necessary resources to succeed in their role.
