A Mentor is a trusted role model and supportive friend for youth ages 7–17, building strong relationships through trust, consistency, positive example - and, most importantly, by having fun together.

Here's What to Expect

- 1. Apply: Fill out an application here or our interest form on the website.
- 2. **References:** We ask for 4 references you'll include their info in your application.
- 3. **Orientation & Interview:** We'll set up a time to meet, get to know each other, and go over what mentoring with us looks like.
- 4. **Background Check:** An online background check keeps things safe and secure for everyone involved.
- 5. Fingerprinting: Done right at the Partners office simple and convenient.
- 6. **Home Visit:** A Case Manager will schedule a time to visit your home to ensure it's a safe and appropriate environment for a child.
- 7. **Mentor Training:** You'll attend a 2-hour in-person training at the Partners office to get set up for success.

Commitment Guidelines

Time Together: Spend about 3 hours a week with your Mentee for one year.

Stick to Your Commitment: Your Mentee is counting on you!

Group & Program Activities: Join 2 fun Group Activities, 1 Life Skills Activity, participate in 1 Community Service Project, and attend 1 Mentor Only Workshop (focused discussions and support) annually.

Stay Connected with Program Staff: Return your Case Manager's calls, weekly for the first 3 months, every 2 weeks for the next 9, and monthly after a year.
