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

INTERNATIONAL CONTEST "WHY I HAVE SO MUCH LOVE FOR THE EUCHARIST"?

The Ministry of the Friends of Jesus and Mary is pleased to announce a written composition contest based on the following topic: "Love for the Eucharist".

This contest will give the opportunity to provide experiences that stimulate children's thinking. It will encourage their desire for exploring a variety of expressive forms in writing about their Love for the Eucharist.

The contest is open to all children in the prayer group of the "Friends and Jesus and Mary" at the elementary level (grades 2-5), middle school level (grades 6-8) and senior high school level (grades 9-12).

Specifications for the contest:

1. An Advisory Committee will conduct all the activities.
2. The leader of the prayer groups participating in the contest will select one child per grade level and will submit the form below, properly completed before November 1, 2004.
3. The leader in charge of the Ministry in each country or state, will select three compositions at each level among the various prayer groups in that area, and will submit them to the FCP before Noviembre 15, 2004
4. All participants will be required to present a hand written composition either in English or Spanish, based on the given topic and containing a maximum of:
 - a) 25 words for childrens from 7-9 years.
 - b) 50 words for childrens from 10-12 years.
 - c) 100 words for young from 13-15 years.
 - d) 200 words for young from 16-18 years.
 - e) The leaders will submit the selected child work to Florida Center for Peace no later than November 15, 2004.
5. A panel of judges will be named to evaluate the compositions and select the winners on an anonymous basis. Judges' decisions will be final.
6. All participants will be awarded a diploma .The awards will be given to the winners at the Eucharistic Conference on February 13, 2005.
7. Winners will be notified before January 31, 2005

**INTERNATIONAL CONTEST
WHY I HAVE SO MUCH LOVE FOR THE EUCHARIST**

**RULES FOR EVALUATION OF COMPOSITIONS
AND SELECION OF WINNERS**

1. There will be a panel of three judges to evaluate the compositions per grade level.
2. Each member of the group will read the compositions and will select one to discuss with the group.
3. Each group will determine the winners' score based on a scale of 0 to 5 points for each of the following aspects:
 - a) Originality
 - b) Grammatical Structure
 - c) Spelling
 - d) Presentation
4. The maximum number of points will be 20
5. The first place winner will be the child who obtains the highest score. Second and third place winners will be selected using the same method.
6. The decision of the judges will be final and will not be subject to revisions.
7. The winners will be notified to Florida Center for Peace with the below form attached to each composition.
8. Judges will return all students' work to Florida Center for Peace.

Our job is to do good

Talk about the story. Talk about their daily activities. Do they expect to be paid for every single thing they do? Are they paid to do house chores or to study? What do their parents do around the house? Who repays them? What do they understand by responsibility and duty? Have they encountered something difficult this week? Is there something they really would like to do but seems impossible? For instance, what problems are there in the neighborhood? Can anyone do anything about them? What?

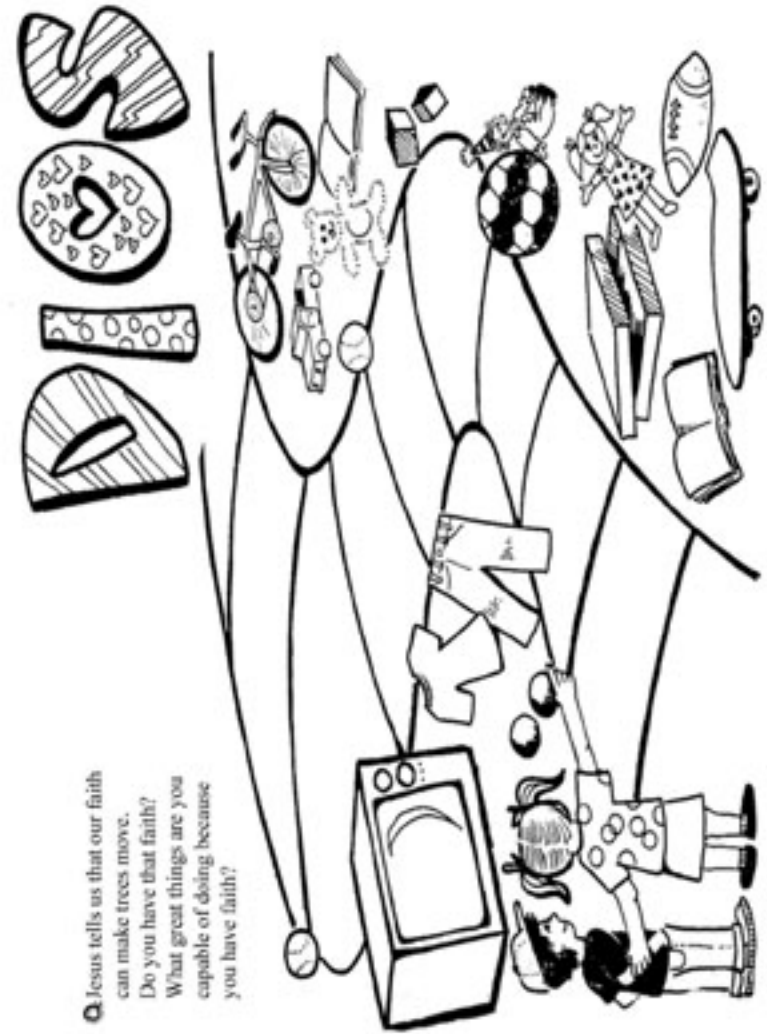
Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- Jesus tells his friends that when they do what they are supposed to do, they are already rewarded. Do you expect a reward when you do your homework, get good grades, or do your chores at home?
- Jesus tells this friend that if they had but a little faith they wouldn't be surprised to see the great wonders that God performs. Have you ever felt you did something great because God helped you? What great things are you capable of?

Activities and prayer. Draw and cut out paper trees. Each child should write down one difficulty (a problem at home or in the neighborhood, a bad relationship with a classmate or a teacher, and so on) he or she would like to eliminate. On the other side of the tree, the children should write: "I believe in you, Jesus." Each child should then place his or her tree on a poster board. As they do this, all respond: "God gives us a spirit of fortitude and love."

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus, tell him what you think your duties are and ask him for help. Tell him you believe he is with you and will help you, even with the most difficult things. Tell him what you want to do:



Q Jesus tells us that our faith can make trees move.

• For example: *I will do my house chores without anybody reminding me.*

• For example: *I will ask Jesus for help when something seems too difficult for me.*

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the good things in life. What kinds of things that you cannot buy (such as beaches, mountains, and so on) do they appreciate? Do they regularly say *thank you*? The lepers (and the Samaritan doubly so) were rejected. Who are the people who are rejected today? Tell the children about Saint Francis of Assisi, who kissed a leper because he saw the face of Jesus in him; about Dorothy Day, who worked among the homeless; or Martin de Porres, who always forgave those who insulted him. Why would these people do such things? Have they ever felt rejected or seen someone being rejected?

Activities and prayer. Prepare a large bowl with water. Each child should wash his or her hands in the bowl and give thanks for something received and ask for something they want. All answer: "Thank you, Jesus." They should then take the bowl into the Offertory procession as a symbol of their gratefulness for the gifts received from God.

- Jesus heals 10 lepers, but only one comes back to thank him.
When was the last time you thanked Jesus for all he has done for you?

You are there.

Are you the one who returns to Jesus or one of the nine? Do you think Jesus felt disappointed that the nine didn't even look back? What would you tell Jesus about the other nine?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- Jesus tells the Samaritan leper who returned that he has been saved because of this faith and gratitude. Do you thank GOD for the gifts you receive each day?
- The Samaritan was a foreigner, and the Israelites didn't like Samaritans. Do you dislike people who are different?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about the things you have received this week for which you are grateful. Thank him and tell him what you would like to do this week.

- For Example: *I will thank my mom (or another adult in my house) for the nice things that person does for me.*
- For example: *When I pray, I will try to include someone who seems to be alone or rejected by the others.*

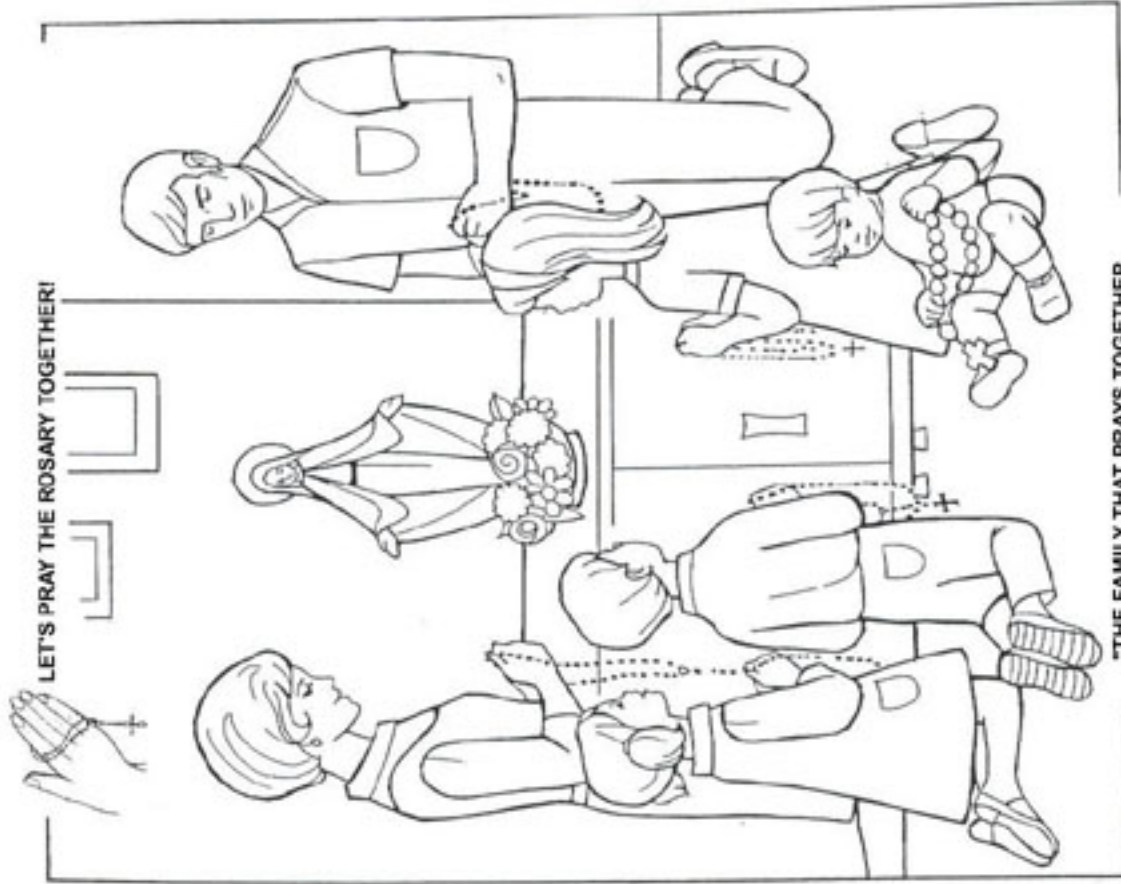

With your ten finger














OUR LADY OF FAMILIA



On May 13, 1917, the blessed Virgin appeared to three little shepherd children at Fatima, in Portugal. Their names were Lucy, Jacinta and Francisco. The beautiful Lady was dressed in white, and she stood on bright cloud over a small oak tree. From her right hand hung a white Rosary. She said to the children: "have no fear. I come from heaven. I want you children to come here on the thirteenth day of each month, until October. Then I will tell you who I am."

On October 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary again appeared to the children of Fatima. She said: "I am the Lady of the Rosary. I have come to warn the faithful to amend their lives and ask pardon for their sins. People must not continue to offend our Lord, already so deeply offended. They must say the Rosary."

Here you will find all the mysteries in disorder. Can you put them in order? In the box beside the picture write the name of the mystery and the group to which it belongs. Color the box of the Joyful Mystery in green, the Luminous mysteries in yellow, the Sorrowful mysteries in purple and the Glorious mysteries in red. Cut them and place them in the correct order.

Mary learns from the angel Gabriel that God wishes her to be the Mother of God and she humbly accepts.

Be humble and obedient.



2. THE VISITATION

Mary goes to visit and help her cousin Elizabeth.

Lk. 1:39-56

Be kind and helpful like Mary.

3. THE BIRTH OF JESUS

Jesus is born in a poor stable in Bethlehem.

Lk. 2:1-20

Share what I have with others for the love of Jesus.

4. THE PRESENTATION

Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the temple to offer him to the Father.

Lk. 2:22-39

I will offer myself to the Father.

5. THE FINDING OF THE CHILD JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

Jesus stays in the temple in the midst of the learned doctors to talk to them about God.

Lk. 2:42-52

I will talk to all my friends about Jesus.

LUMINOUS MYSTERIES

To be prayed on Thursdays.

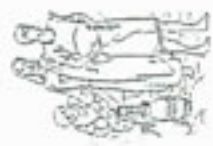


1. BAPTISM IN THE JORDAN

Jesus came to be baptized by John the Baptist. The voice of the Father declares him the Beloved Son.

Matt. 3:13-16

Pray to be faithful to our baptismal promise.



2. THE WEDDING AT CANA

Jesus changed water into wine through the intervention of His Mother.

Jn. 2:1-12

Pray to do whatever Jesus tells us (accomplishment of God's will).

3. PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S KINGDOM

Jesus proclaims the coming of the kingdom of God, as he calls to conversion and reconciliation.

Mt. 2:3-13

Pray for the grace to forgive always.



4. THE TRANSFIGURATION

The glory of God shines forth from the face of Christ as the Father commands the apostles to listen to Jesus.

Lk. 9:28-36

Pray for a change of heart.

5. THE INSTITUTION OF THE EUCHARIST

Christ offers his body and blood as food and testifies His love for us.

Lk. 22:14-20

Pray to be always in the state of grace to receive the Eucharist.

SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

To be prayed on Tuesday and Fridays.



1. THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

The thought of our sins and His coming sufferings causes Jesus to sweat blood.

Lk. 22:41-45

I will pray like Jesus when something is hard for me.



2. THE SCOURGING AT THE PILLAR

Jesus is beaten for our sins but He does not complain.

Matt. 27:26

For love of Jesus I will not make a fuss over things I do not like.



3. THE CROWNING WITH THORNS

They make fun of Jesus and put a crown of thorns on His head.

Matt. 27:28-31

I will ask Jesus to help me to never make fun of others.



4. THE CARRYING OF THE CROSS

Jesus carries His heavy cross to Calvary.

Lk. 23:26-32

I will offer for love of Jesus what is hard for me.



5. THE CRUCIFIXION

Jesus suffers on the cross for the love of me... He forgives everyone....!

Matt. 27:33-50

I will forgive everybody who hurts me.

GLORIOUS MYSTERIES

To be prayed on Wednesday, and Sunday



1. THE RESURRECTION

Jesus rises from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Matt. 28:3

Jesus, help me to love you much and to overcome the obstacles in my way to You.



2. THE ASCENSION OF JESUS

Jesus goes up to heaven.

Lk. 24:50-51

I will try to be good so that I can be forever with Jesus in heaven.



3. THE DESCENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus sends the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles.

Acts 2:2-4

I will ask Mary to help me to always listen to the Holy Spirit.



4. THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY

Jesus takes His Blessed Mother, body and soul, up to heaven.

Rev. 12:14-16

Mary, my Mother, keep my heart and soul pure and holy for Jesus.



5. THE CORONATION OF MARY

Jesus crowns Mary Queen of heaven and earth.

Rev. 12:1-3

Mary, we crown you as Queen of our hearts so that you may guide and transform us.

The judge couldn't play deaf any longer

Exod. 17:8-13;

Talk about the story. Is there something they really want? What sacrifices and efforts are they willing to make to achieve this? Are they easily discouraged when they don't immediately get what they want, or do they continue working and praying? Do they think that what they ask for is always good? Which prayers do they think God listens to more willingly? Have they ever had the experience of praying very hard for something and getting it? What are they praying for right now?

Activities. Dramatize the story of the judge and the widow. What does the widow ask for? Is she right in asking for it? Change the middle or the end of the story. For instance, pretend that the judge is good and the widow is unreasonable. Should the judge then pay attention to the widow?

Final prayer. Make a litany of petitiones. Each child should present a need or desire and all answer: "I know you are listening to me, Jesus"

If you have been asking for something for a long time and it seems that no one is paying attention, do you easily give up? If you don't want to give something up, but you are being nagged so much that you finally decide to give in, do you do it willingly or reluctantly?

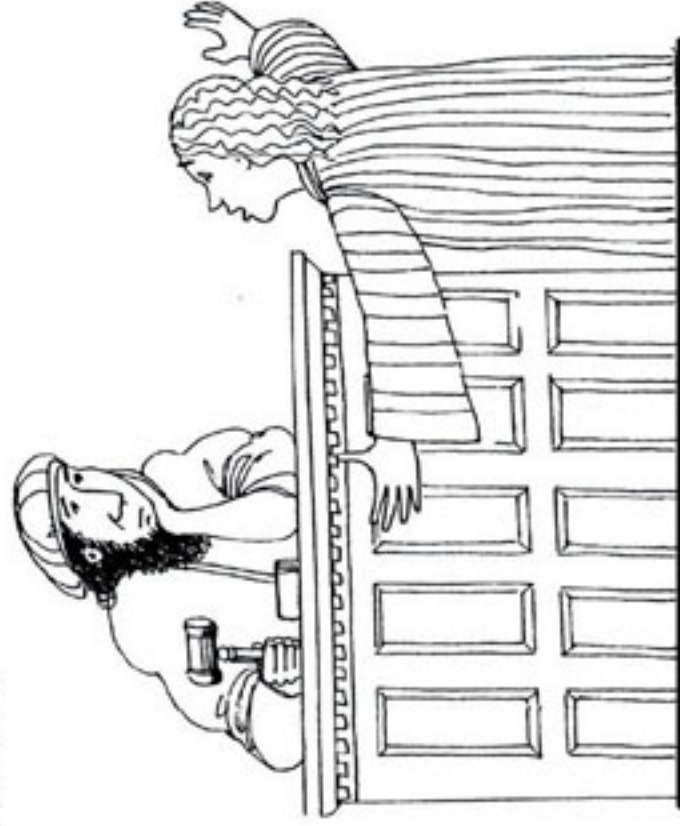
Jesus, your friend, invites you:

Jesus says that sometime people do what they are asked just to get someone off their backs. But God is loving and will listen to those who ask him for justice. Are you even when it seems that God is not answering you? Do you think that what you usually ask for is good and just, or usually just a whim?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about something you really, really want. Tell him you know he will do whatever is best for you. Tell him what you want to do this week.

- For example: *I will willingly do something that my family asks me to do.*
- For example: *I will pray with faith, knowing that God will provide me with what is best for me.*



Q A judge finally gives in to a woman who asks him for justice. When you ask for something, and it seems that no one is listening, do you give up? Or, do you persist and keep on asking?

God doesn't listen to show-offs

Talk about the story. Do they ever hear people speak about others as "inferior"? Do they consider some people inferior? Is there anyone they dislike so much that they cannot think of anything good to say about that person?

When they do something good, why do they do it? Do they sometimes do things just to please their parents who love them so much?
When they love somebody, are they able to excuse their faults?

Activities. Dramatize the story of the pharisee and the publican in the temple. One child should play God and ask the Pharisee why he does what he does. Does he do good deeds so he will be considered the best guy in the neighborhood?
The child playing God should tell the pharisee that the most important thing to remember is to love God and others.

Final prayer. Have each child cut out a heart and write his or her name on it. Under their name, they should write their commitment for the week and then place the heart in a basket to be presented at the Offertory. As they do so, all respond: "Give me a sincere heart, Jesus"

Jesus, doesn't say that what the first man did was bad, but that his motivations were wrong. Did he perform good deeds just to be applauded or because he really wanted to be God's friend? When you behave well, why do you do it?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about the good things you have done this week. Thank him because he was there to help you. Tell him what you would like to do think that you are the best. Tell Jesus what you would like to do this week.

- For example: *I will thank God for something good a person I don't like did.*
- For example: *I will do something well, even if no one is going to see it.*

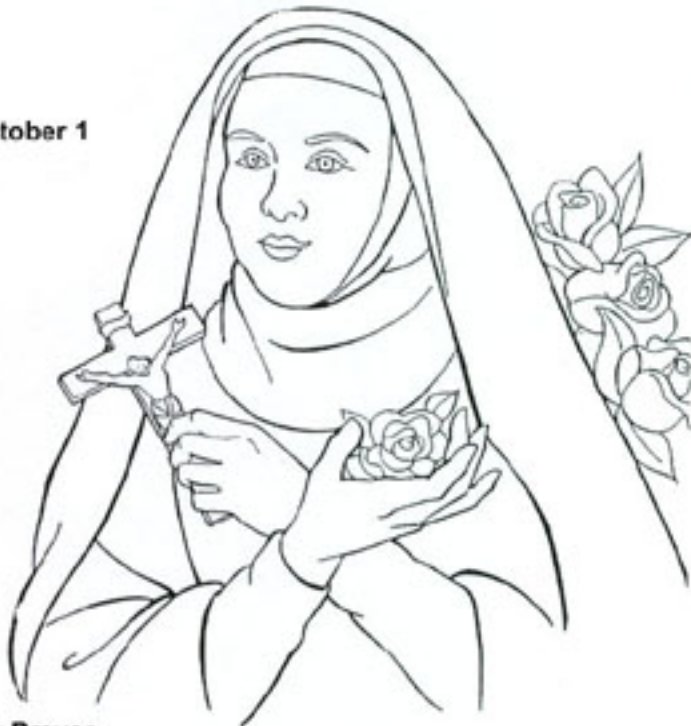
SAINT THERESE OF THE CHILD JESUS

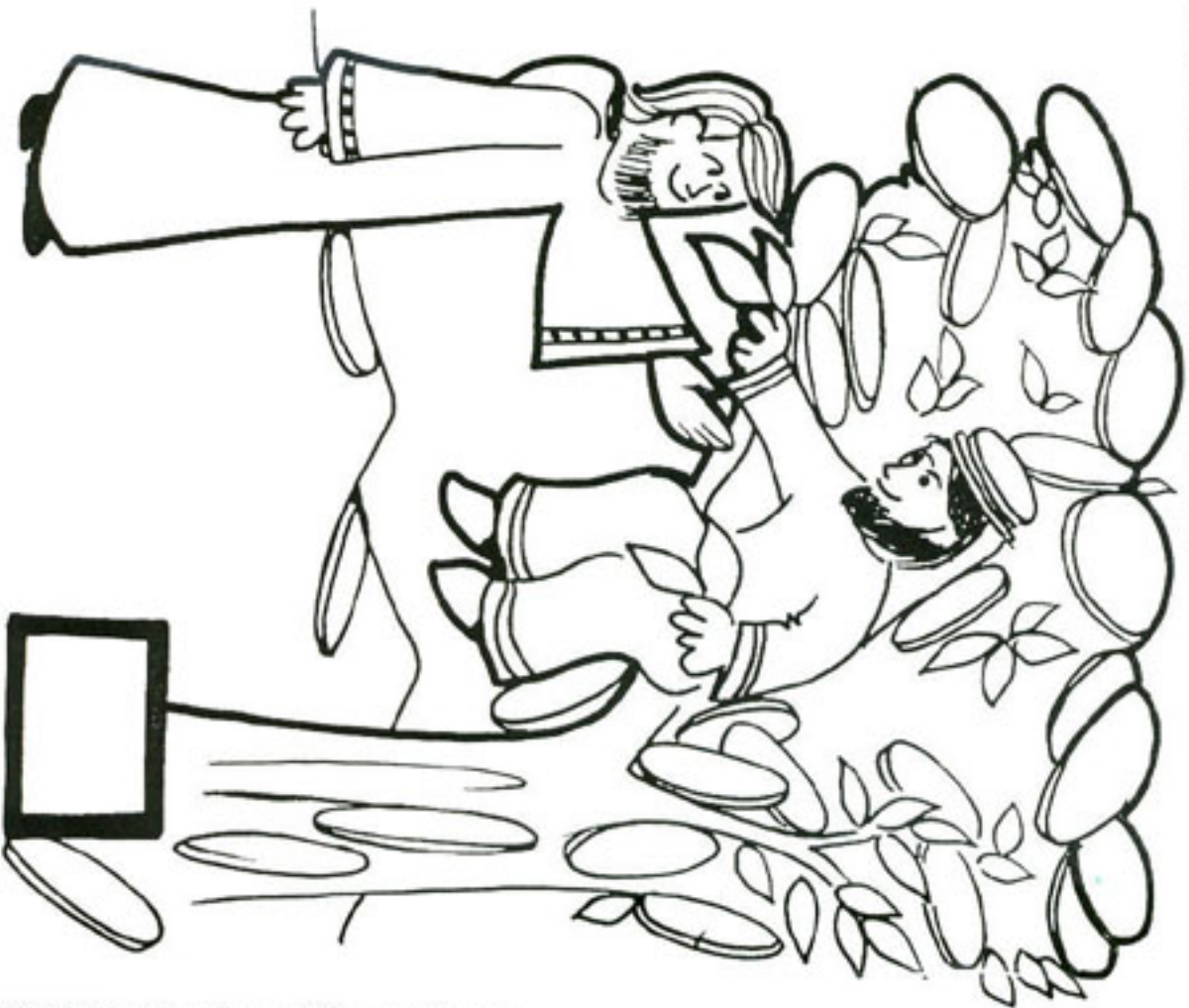

was one of the four writers of the gospels. He also wrote about the early Christian Church to whom Jesus sent the Holy Spirit. Luke was a doctor.



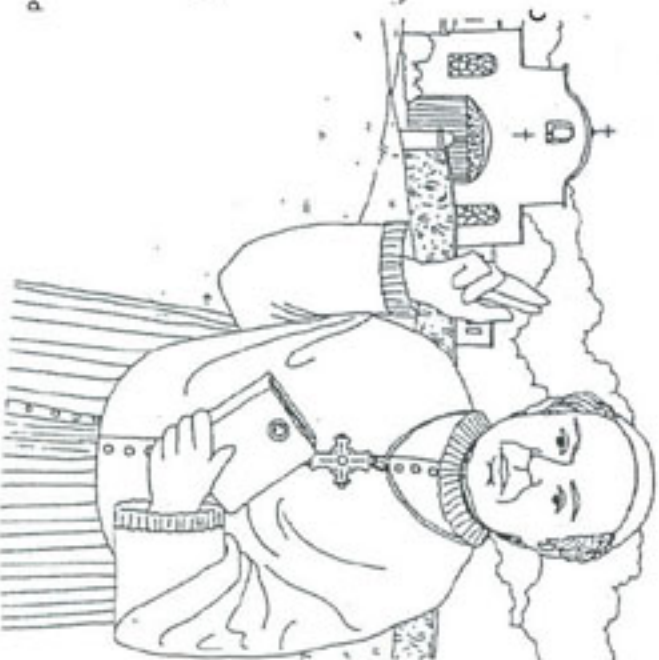

Saint Anthony Mary Claret

October 24

Born in Salient, Anthony worked as a missionary in Catalonia and the Canary Islands for ten years. In 1849 he started the Congregation of Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The institute is known as "the Claretians." Father Claret was appointed Archbishop of Santiago in Cuba. He founded the Teaching Sisters of Mary Immaculate. At the request of Pope Pius XI, he returned to Spain and devoted himself to missionary work and the spreading of good literature. Anthony also spread devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and the Immaculate Heart of Mary by preaching and writings. Anthony died a Cistercian monastery in France on October 24, 1870. He was canonized by Pope Pius XII in 1950.



Saint Paul of the Cross

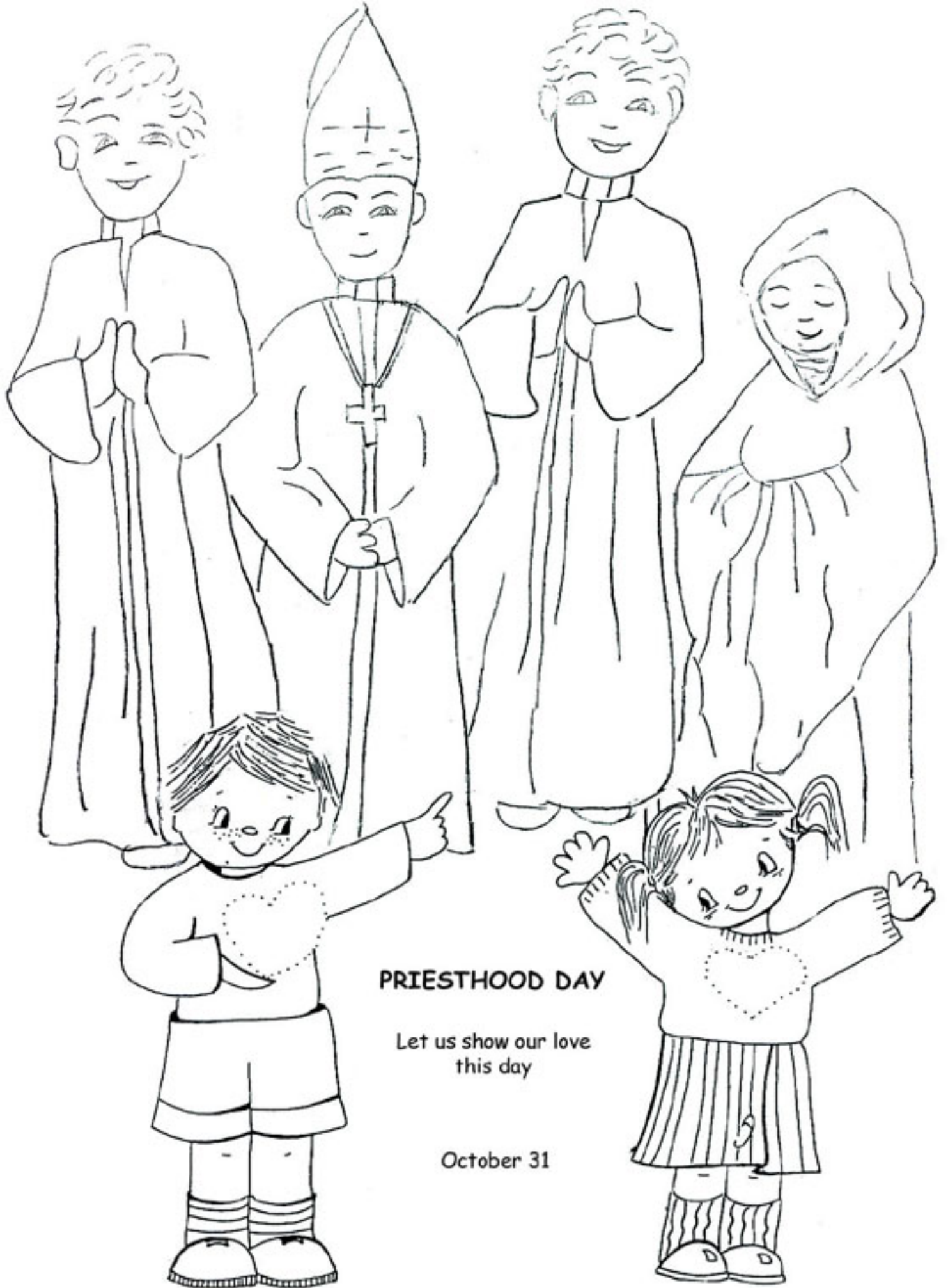
October 19

Paul was born in Genova, Italy, on January 3, 1694. After his ordination he was inspired in a vision to find a congregation in honor of the Passion of Jesus Christ. He was invested by the bishop with the habit that had been shown to him in the vision.

Paul chose as the badge of his congregation a heart with three nails, in memory of the sufferings of Jesus. The Rule he wrote was approved by Benedict XIV. A large community of the Passionists lived at Church of Saints John and Paul in Rome.

The work of the Passionists was preaching to the people in parishes. For fifty years Paul remained the untiring missionary of Italy. He believed himself to be useless servant and a great sinner, though God granted him many wonderful gifts of soul. Paul died at Rome in the year 1775, at the age of eighty-one.

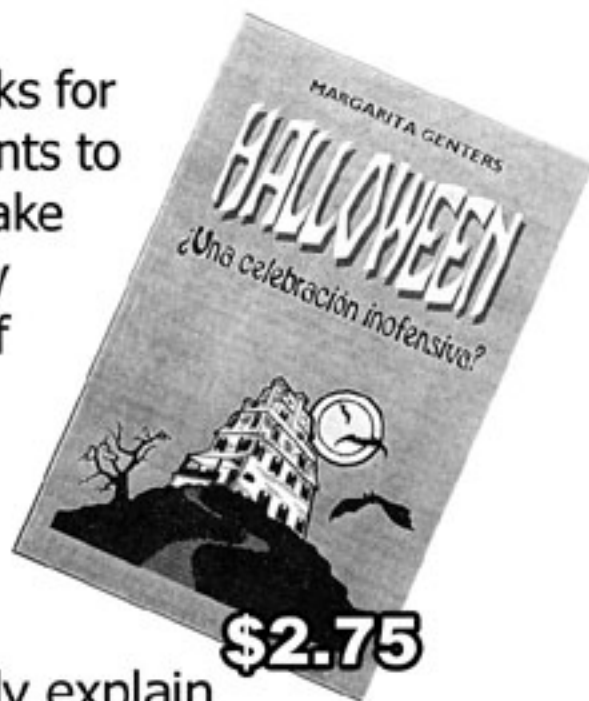
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
