Questions and Answers



Q: What are the requirements to show in the CCF?

A: The sire and dam of your horse must be nominated to our program the year your horse was BORN and prior to the Weanling Halter class deadline in September. Your horse must also be APHA registered, and born in CANADA. Late nominations are accepted for a fee, but note that late nomination entries are not eligible for the Grand Aggregate Award. See our Rules & Regulations and our Aggregate Rules for full details!

Q: Once nominations are complete, are there any other fees?

A: Entry Fees and Memberships are the only fees that you'll see with CCF. Exhibitors and owners must be APHC members to compete. Stallion owners/nominators must also be members the year they nominate their stud!

Q: What are the benefits to nominating early?

A: Give your horse the best opportunity to show and remain eligible for the Grand Aggregate Award. Oh and Cheaper fees! After each deadline the fees double, and after the weanling class, an additional \$200 late fee.

Q: How is the nomination money distributed?

A: The nomination money is divided evenly between 4 years, and then divided again between the classes offered for horses at that age. Each class held will have the nomination money plus 100% of entry fees added to the purse.

Q: What Classes are offered? And when are they hosted in 2026?

A: Yearling Halter, at the Spectacular Spring Classic June 5-7

2 YO WJ/WT Classes, at the Sunny South Show July 11/12

Weanling Halter, Yearling LL, 3 YO WP/HUS at the Fall Classic Sept 26/27

Q: What are the Class Fees and Deadlines?

A: All CCF class fees are \$125 to enter, \$100 for entry and \$25 for office/awards fees. Class entry deadlines are usually the last Friday before the show, you are still able to enter up until the night before the class, late fees apply.

Q: Aggregate eligibility, what's that?

A: The CCF offers a Grand Aggregate Award. You must have your horse eligible for the CCF prior to the weanling class, then enter classes every year to gain points, the horse that has accumulated the highest number of points after 4 years of showing WINS! If you can't show in a class you can pay an eligibility fee to stay in the running.

The Grand Aggregate Award is presented after the 3 YO Western Pleasure class hosted at the Fall Classic.

Q: Do I have to ride my horse both Western and English?

A: No, you may choose to only ride Western or only ride English. For the Aggregate tabulations the highest amount of points earned from one OR the other, not both, classes will be added to your total.

Q: What is the cut off date for Weanlings, Early/Late classes?

A: The cut off date for Weanling classes is not announced until the Final Entry deadline. The entries are divided evenly and then a date is chosen that splits the two groups up by age.

Q: How do I win Non-Pro awards?

A: Super simple, upload a copy of your APHA Ammy Card to the Entry Form and you're automatically eligible!
