# A Reflection on the Gospel this week. (Rev. Jo) "The Unjust Judge" Luke 18 v 1-8



Look at this picture: Whilst it is a picture of our gospel reading today, it has similarity to a queue I was in in a well known large supermarket in Seacroft. I (and someone who shall remain nameless) had 3 trolley loads of beer, snacks and harvest goods, ready for our "Beer and Hymns" evening at Allerton Bywater. Standing there in my black dress with a dog collar, (feeling slightly self-conscious about the amount of alcohol I was putting on the

conveyor belt), I looked around at the queue behind me... I knew what they were thinking ... "Oh no, I had to get behind her,... she's got so much,... it's going to take hours!" The checkout assistant sitting in front of me, head in hands asking... "Have you got any bags?" (No) "How many of this beer?" "How many bags of crisps?!" The checkout assistant behind her looking over - a "Rather, you than me" look in her eyes. After about 15 minutes we finally managed to repack the three trolleys and hearing the sighs of relief from all those behind me in the queue I opened my Apple Pay App on my phone to pay, and yes you guessed it. "You can't pay with that - we have a limit on how much goes through in one transaction. You've exceeded that limit. We're going to have to start again and put it through in 2 transactions."

Imagine how you would feel if a) you were me, b) if you were behind me in the queue, c) if you were the checkout assistant (who was due to go on her break). The looks on all our faces resembled the ones in the picture above.

But do you know - the checkout assistant was so so kind. Through my (and my friend's) many "Sorry's" and crippling embarrassment she showed patience and yes, care and love as she called security. (I had already written the News Headline "Vicar escorted from premises because she could not pay for 3 trolley loads of Alcohol!) She was not interested in the complaining of the queue behind. She focussed on me and my pleading eyes! Quickly she arranged a closed till to be opened and let us start again with out the fury of those looking on. This woman did not know me but, even though she was tired, frustrated and probably angry, she showed compassion. "And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night?" (V7) My experience, "Yes, every time!" - Maybe not how we first thought he would - but trust Him.




