
Gospel Reflection

"He is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive." Luke 20 v 38

One of biggest things you have been teaching me recently is that "if it ain't broke, don't fix it". The way things are used, re-used and then used again until every element has been completely used up is awe inspiring. Only when the thing is completely dead or gone should a replacement be found. And yet, even then, our Gospel reading tells us this week, death is not the end. God can take things which are dead and bring them back to life. He never gives up.

In house group at Allerton Bywater on Monday we studied the story of "the raising of Lazarus". We discussed the many feelings of those present when Lazarus, a beloved brother, son and friend laid in a tomb dead and Jesus didn't rush to his aid. Mary Magdalene ... seemed angry and betrayed that the man who claimed to be the Son of God did not get to them in time. (Maybe she felt she'd anointed the wrong man with the expensive oil of burial that day!) Martha, was still busy, still worrying about the practicality of the stench of a body, if the tomb was opened. The religious leaders watching on, blind to what was happening, more interested in proving that Jesus was a heretic. The disciples, tired, wondering why he was bothering with someone who had already gone. The frustration and anxiety of thinking that Jesus had abandoned them in their time of need, reminding of us when we doubt God's presence in our lives. But, had they not learnt anything during their time at his side? He'd healed the blind, fed the hungry, stilled stormy waters, turned water into wine... what more did He have to do? (Looking at the stone in front of the entrance to Lazarus' tomb, He knew what he was going to

have to do.) No wonder he "wept". As we remember those who gave up their lives for our freedom this weekend, Luke 20 v 38 offers us hope. Our God "is not the God of the dead, but the living, for to him all are alive." The soldiers who died for our freedom, left us with a legacy of sacrifice and love that brings communities together in remembrance. "They will not grow old, as we that are left grow old." And so it was with Jesus, but His sacrifice, made once for all, was not made for this life alone. He gave up his life in order that we might live for eternity, in peace and love and fellowship with our creator, God. When we come to the altar each week we enter into an act of remembrance which celebrates not only His sacrifice, but also His resurrection. Our soldiers conquered our enemies but Jesus conquered death itself. This is why the angels said to the women on Easter Sunday: "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!" and we can sing: "O death, where is your sting?"
