Gospel Reflection

"Trust is an act of defiance in an uncertain world"

Luke 21 v 5-19

I come from a family of builders and spent my school holidays helping my dad work on on the roof of Ely cathedral, so I can easily picture the disciples looking up at the temple walls and thinking it would last forever. We live in a strange paradox. Fundamentally we know that everything we have worked for materially in life will be destroyed or handed to someone else. Yet at the same time, we are driven to build, create and acquire which in itself isn't bad. It is just keeping a perspective and placing things in the right order of importance in our lives. Imagine building a sandcastle on the beach. At the end of the day the tide will come and wash it away. We build our own kinds of sandcastles; our careers, our homes, our plans for the future. They're good things, but not eternal.

Jesus tells us not to hold onto these things, not to imagine we have to hold the world together on our own. These things are an illusion. When the stones fall or

the tide washes away our parts of our life it is God's love that remains. As the tide moves and the sand it stripped back to the bare rock beneath, what is left is Jesus.

Do you remember being a child, on the beach, up to your waste in the sea holding tightly to your dad's hand when the waves were rough? It's like clinging to God when everything else feels uncertain.

Even in the hardest moments, Jesus says something beautiful: "This will give you an opportunity to bear witness." Every difficulty can become a place where God's love shines. When we stay calm in a fearful world, when we act kindly in a cruel one, when we speak peace instead of anger we show the world who we belong to. Our



very kindness and peace is an act of defiance. Lord give us faith to trust in your presence, courage to bear witness to your love, and hearts that stand firm in hope. Amen. (Rev. Bob).
