A Reflection on the Gospel this week. (Rev. Sarah) "Your faith has made you well" Luke 18 v 1-8



So we have a bunch of lepers, (who were forbidden by Jewish law to come near people in case they infected them), that came to Jesus and asked for his mercy on them. As per the custom, Jesus sends them to the priests. They were still lepers at this point but they did as they were instructed – they were obedient.

As they went, they were healed. These men had stepped out in faith and were made well. However, only one came back and it was the Samaritan. Oh my goodness, a Samaritan? How could that be the case? He was loud about what had happened! He came back to give thanks. Jesus noticed the lack of gratitude in that the other nine didn't come back!

We can always be thankful to God and in unexpected ways too. A well known Bible commentator's wallet was stolen. In his diary that night he wrote about the things he was thankful for – that he'd never been robbed before, that even though they took his wallet, they didn't take his life; even though they took everything, it wasn't much and he was the one who was robbed, not doing the robbing.

Have you ever thought about how you might describe yourself in one word? It's a bit of a challenge isn't it? What about when we speak about others? Is it too easy to make a quick judgment? Ages ago I was in John Lewis in town, it was my day off. I was dressed casually and was wearing a fleece jacket to keep warm. I may have been mistaken but when I sat down to have my food the couple at the other table kind of drew their bags towards them a bit more. I may have made an incorrect assumption but that's what it looked like. I wonder what the difference would have been if I was wearing my clerical collar and a nice jacket? I was the same person! Would their opinion of me have changed?

What made the Samaritan turn back to say, 'thank you'? Was he just different? Perhaps his faith in Jesus got bigger as he was healed physically?

So where are we? Would we be in the group who think of some people as outcasts? Who might the outcasts be for us? Can we do anything to help? Jesus always gives the example of being with those who society has shut out. How can we be serving practically and praying for opportunities to help others? Are there things which we need to thank God for? 'Your faith has made you well', changes our attitude and spurs us on. Are we really grateful to God for what he's done for us? If we were to write down three things each day that we're grateful to God for, would our attitude change?

The other day I was extremely annoyed about a particular situation and couldn't see a way through without things taking longer. In the middle of my tears, I received an email to say that someone had applied for a grant on my behalf and was being awarded £1000 to the work of my future ministry. I was stopped in my tracks and thanked God for this – I hadn't even applied – but God knew what I needed.I'm going to flip a saying here in that sometimes it's our altitude (looking to God) which determines our attitude (how we face each day with his help). Jesus really does help us to live as he wants us to, even thought we mess up all the time. The nine lepers got it wrong, but one did the right thing.
