# A Reflection on the Gospel this week. (Rev. Jo) "The Rich Man and Lazarus". Luke 19-End



In the parable we read this week, Jesus doesn't mince His words. This one is meant to hone us, to re-shape us. Llke a carpenter chisels at a hard piece of wood, so Jesus' words chisel at our hearts. Jesus' call is for us to live differently.

Jesus is not saying you have to be poor to be able to believe in HIm. Rather, using the contrast in the lives of the two men, Jesus is warning us that this life here on earth isn't the be all and end all and we need to show compassion in all situations. This can leave us with more questions than answers though.

Why does the rich man have no name and yet the beggar is given the name which means - "God helps?" Why does the rich man not see and help his poor neigbour? He must have been close to eat the crumbs from the table...

Jesus' words levels the playing field, because He is saying: "However much we have here on earth, our entry into Heaven is dependent on only one thing. Our relationship with God and Humankind."

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and all your mind", and "Love your neighbour as yourself". (Matt 22). The kingdom of God does not measure life by what you have but by what you share.. Death is the equaliser. Rich or poor and all inbetween,, respected or rejected and all in between... black or white. Black or white and all in between....I could go on.

Heaven and hell aren't just about where we'll "end up".. They're about present choices. Each time the rich man stepped over Lazarus to get to his table, his life, his career, his wealth, his success... so he created a chasm for his after life... the chasm that separated him from God for eternity.

Everytime we "step over" someone to get what we want without showing compassion, everytime we turn our backs on someone in need and everytime we refuse to share the blessings God gives us on this earth and the hope of our future in Jesus, we are also building that chasm. Faith without compassion is a closed gate. Compassion opens the door to the kingdom.


