# A Reflection on the Gospel this week. (Rev. Bob) ""Why does your teacher eat with tax-collectors and sinners?".



Last Sunday's Holy Cross Day made a strange contrast with the London march where the far right Tommy Robinson defended Christianity with St George's flags and crosses. Yet what does the cross mean? The Cross is a stumbling block to many. It is a crime scene. An innocent man has been killed illegally by the state. Jesus' death representing all suffering. When we understand our humanity through the Cross, Jesus' death and resurrection, we understand that humility and suffering are central to God's love for us. I don't agree with all that is happening politically or the way the most needy and poor in our society are paying for the mistakes of the wealthy and greedy. Yet Jesus himself was, a refugee, Jewish, dark skinned, oppressed under a military occupation, died because of an unfair trial where the political authorities were more frightened of the mob than the rule of law or justice. Jesus told us to care for the sick, homeless, hungry and love our enemies. He asked us to treat our neighbours as we would ourselves and share the riches God has given us with those in need. Nicodemus (John 3) asked questions in the dead of night and we ask God the difficult questions from our own dark places? There are no clever, pithy replies from Jesus. Instead we see Jesus' humanity in the Gospels; tears in a garden, pain and humiliation on a cross. A call to follow, to sacrifice, to seek and desire for relationship with God and one another. To be born again, A new you. A new me. A new world. Not from flesh but from above. Light, not dark. Love not hatred. Beauty not ugliness. Life, not death. Reaching out. Making all things new. So please do not let me have to drive over flags with crosses on, explain to my children why some people are hated because they come from somewhere else or have a different colour skin or worship God in a different way. This cross is a stumbling block to the world, its humility beyond most understanding, but it is everything to me; "that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.'




