CoVB Considering Billing For Ambulance Service

Unlike other cities in Hampton Roads, prehospital emergency medical care and ambulance transport has been provided free of charge in Virginia Beach. City Council was recently briefed on a study to roll out EMS (Emergency Medical Service) billing. The study was commissioned by the Va. Beach Council of Rescue Squads, Inc., also known as the Rescue Council.

On Dec. 10, City Council will vote on a resolution to prepare for an ambulance billing system, with final approval during the budget approval process next spring.

VB Rescue, a system of 10 individual volunteer rescue squads, collaborates with the Dept. of EMS. Last year there were 54,000 service calls, with approximately 70% of those calls resulting in a hospital transport.

Rescue squads are funded through donations, grants and money from the general fund, but have faced a decline in fundraising and increasing costs for supplies, pharmacy items, ambulances and more.

The Rescue Council supports "compassionate billing," a practice that could include not charging for ambulance service when the user cannot pay and reducing or eliminating co-pays for insured residents. It is stressed that no patient would ever be denied services. If a billing program is not approved, City Manager Duhaney said residents could face higher taxes to cover the department's increased costs. He also said there would be public outreach to inform citizens about the proposal.
