Pleasure House Point (PHP) Project

PAPCL President Buddy Wall recently sent an email to league members about an issue that could possibly have a citywide negative impact on Flood Mitigation Projects, including the Bow Creek Stormwater Park.

Pleasure House Point (PHP), south of the Lesner Bridge is scheduled to transform from a dredge dump site (created in the early 70s) to a natural wetland area. The site, which is approximately eight acres, was used to store sand and silt from the channel dredging area near the bridge to ensure boats could move freely in and out of Broad Bay.

dredge site spoils hundreds of trees will be removed to create a wetland, which will give the City wetland mitigation credits to offset projects such as the Bow Creek Stormwater Park. The Bayfront Advisory Commission (BAC) video link below can give you more insight into what are bank credits and the project.

While live oak and water oak trees will be replanted in this area, tree removal and wildlife disturbance has many citizens objecting to this project, in addition to the short amount of time between the BAC presentation and City Council vote on January 7.

Our District 3 representative's concern is that *not* approving the project will delay or stop current flood mitigation projects, such as the Lake Windsor flood gate and Bow Creek Stormwater Park, as there will be no wetlands credits available to offset the projects and allow work to continue.

Most residents want to preserve the natural areas that help to make this city unique and beautiful. It is easy to be torn between wanting to ensure our City's flood projects continue to progress and still support leaving what has become an undisturbed natural area as is if there is any possibility to do so. A understanding broader of all aspects to the PHP project and answers to your questions can help you determine your support of the issue.

December PAPCL Meeting and Potluck Highlights

It was an abbreviated meeting so those attending could partake in the fellowship and holiday potluck.

In addition to officer reports, our Membership Committee Chair, Ruth, said they will kick into full gear in January. New membership apps are blue and indicate the new dues of \$25 per family/household. This is the first increase in dues since the League's founding in 1963.

Flood Committee Chair Bob Jennings said there are movements towards private flood insurance that may be more affordable for homeowners. He cautioned the caveats that include private insurers tend to issue lower payouts than federally funded FEMA insurance, and that policy holders may not be able to return to FEMA once insured by a private provider.
