Recycling Program Survey

The City is asking residents for their input on Virginia Beach's curbside recycling program by completing a 17-question recycling survey that is available at SpeakUpVB.com/Recycling from Oct. 2 through Friday, Nov. 17. Before completing the survey, residents can review the information tabs on the project page, which includes a brief overview of the current state of recycling, the current recycling contract. information about what can be recycled in Virginia Beach and the options available for a recycling program moving forward. The City's curbside recycling contract with Tidewater Fibre Corp. (TFC Recycling) expires in June 2024. The recycling survey will residents' opinions assess recycling and the options available after the contract expires. City leaders will use the results of the survey to develop polices and make decisions on the future of the City's recycling program and how it will be funded in the proposed FY24-25 budget.

September 2023 Meeting Highlights

President Mills attended the VBPD 1st Precinct CAC (Citizens' Advisory Committee) and said break-ins were still a big issue, and residents shouldn't leave any valuables such as money, electronics and guns, in their vehicles.

Public Works engineer Mike Mundy gave stormwater project updates, noting that rainfall this year is down 2" but a recent 1" downpour caused some flooding on roads. Vibration monitors are in place to check vibration levels caused by heavy equipment and prevent damage to home close to stormwater projects.

Councilman Berlucchi was attendance and reminded members he is hosting a District 3 town hall on Thursday, Sept. 14, at the Philippine Cultural Center. He is expecting representation from Public Safety. Stormwater Management, Waste Management, and Code Enforcement. reminded members to call him if they have problems or concerns so he can help accelerate a resolution. When asked about Sentara Way Woods, he said Council denied Checkered Flag's request but they do have buy-right use of the land. He noted the City tried to purchase the property but Checkered Flag would not sell the land. Berlucchi also said the remaining piece of

property which is owned by the City would not be sold. It was noted that Checkered Flag obtained the State—owned sliver of land last summer, increasing the amount of land they own between the dealership and Sabre Rehab Center. The City owned property abuts I-264.

Del. Karen Greenhalgh said she is hosting an energy town hall at Bow Creek Rec Center on Sept. 21 with Virginia Natural Gas and the Virginia Director of Energy at Dominion Energy. It will be recorded and posted to her website (as well as the Medicaid redetermination video.)

Our guest speaker, Elias Paulson of Paulson and Paulson, gave an planning presentation, estate including the description of a will, what probate is and what is expected of an estate's executor. He also said you need to carefully consider when to give power of attorney and the types of power of Paulson attorney. suggested checking with your banking institution to verify what is their policy regarding access to your account or safe deposit box. You can go to Voter Registration & Elections, Municipal Center, Bldg. 14, Mon – Fri., Sept. 22 to Nov. 3, 8 am – 5 pm. *NOTE:* you can also vote on Sat., Oct. 28 and Sat., Nov. 4, 9 am – 5 pm at Voter Registration, the Central Library and four other select locations.
