

Bow Creek Storm Water Park Groundbreaking



The Bow Creek storm water park project groundbreaking was held July 28 at the former golf course club house. It was a crazy hot and humid day, but Parks & Rec set up a tent with fans and had a cold water station for attendees. Many thanks to Councilman Michael Berlucchi for his remarks recalling the disaster, recognizing the difficult times homeowners experienced as a result of Hurricane Matthew's visit, and how well the community came together to help one another. The project is expected to take seven years to complete. Country Club Circle, which from Hannibal Street to leads Rosemont Road, will be closed for the next seven years as it will be the traffic conduit for construction trucks.

BIG CITY ISSUES

_City Council voted 10 - 1 to ask the State Legislature to change the law allowing a 10 -1 District Voting System.

_Project Wayne (rezoning land south of the Green Line) quiet for now, no news this week.

_Comprehensive Plan: the VBCCO will be a participant in any proposed changes to the Comprehensive Plan that affect established, suburban neighborhoods.

_Rudee Loop will be a park. Council will search for a design firm. A parking garage will be included, there's no decision yet on a retail element.

Due to redistricting and renumbering, Del. Greenhalgh's district number will change from District 85 to District 97 with the next State election.

Flood Protection Project Updates

It doesn't take much driving around PAPCL neighborhoods to encounter the latest flood protection work in effect:

_Country Club Circle at Hannibal Street was closed to through traffic, giving Bow Creek Stormwater Park construction traffic an exit to Rosemont Road with the least amount of negative impact to the neighborhood.

_Through traffic on a portion of Presidential Boulevard between Silina and Old Forge was closed to allow for storm drain piping along South Plaza Trail and Presidential Boulevard to the outlet at the Windsor Woods Canal, installation of drainage inlets and catch basins along the route, installation of a water main, and replacement of an existing sanitary sewer line.

-Old Forge Road and Red Lion Road drainage improvements have begun. Storm drain pipes, water and sewer lines will be installed along Old Forge Court and Old Forge Road to Red Lion Road to the Windsor Woods Canal will be installed.

The City's Flood Protection Program is made up of more than 41 projects and programs to be implemented throughout the city over the next 10 years. Most of these projects fall within one of seven master project areas: _Central Resort District

_Eastern Shore Drive Phase 1

- _Stormwater Green Infrastructure (Back Bay & Elizabeth River Wetlands)
- _Lake Bradford and Chubb Lake
- _ Southern Rivers Watershed _ **Windsor Woods, Princess**

Anne Plaza and The Lakes _Linkhorn Bay Drainage Basin

The projects under the Windsor Woods, Princess Anne Plaza and The Lakes area are:

- Princess Anne Plaza N. London Bridge Creek tide gate, pump station and barriers
 The Lakes S. London Bridge Creek channels and gate
 The Lakes flood barriers
 The Lakes Holland Road gate
 Windsor Woods flood barriers
 Windsor Woods pump station
 Windsor Woods Thalia Creek/Lake Trashmore improvements
 Windsor Woods tide gate
 Windsor Woods drainage

-Trustee Betty Warren said we can expect Code Enforcement to start attending meetings again in the fall.


