Find Missing Pets Faster

Increased numbers of stray dogs and cats, combined with owners not claiming pets picked up by Animal Control in a timely manner, has the City's animal shelter over capacity.

The first step to helping you reunite with a loose pet is to ensure they have a collar with your contact information and are micro-chipped. It's equally important to keep the chip up-to-date with your contact info. Virginia Beach Animal Control (VBAC) will attempt to bring your pet home before taking it to the shelter.

Animal Control Officers are on routine patrol from 8 am - 10 pm, seven days a week, with an officer is on stand-by duty after hours to respond to emergency calls for service. If you see a stray and can contain it for pickup by VBAC or if you need an animal control officer respond to a call for service, call (757) 385-4444 and select Option 1.

Social media is a big help in reuniting pets with their owners such as PawBoost; the NextDoor app which has members throughout the area; and Lost and Found Pets-Hampton Roads on Facebook with an even wider reach. For those who don't use social media, old fashion "missing" posters are helpful.

Goodwill and the Aquarium will collect general electronics recycling such as personal computers, cell phones, printers, fax machines, stereo equipment, televisions 50 inches or smaller, and CRT/tube monitors (not TVs). AAA will be accepting used vehicle batteries and old, broken, or expired child safety car seats. No other type of battery will be accepted at this event.

The VBCCO will study and discuss important issues and problems that affect our community and to work toward mutually agreeable solutions as well as provide a forum for the discussion and debate of current topics. On **Wednesday**, **January 24**, starting at **6:30 pm**, the VBCCO is hosting a Q&A session with City Manager, Patrick Duhaney and senior officials in the Planning Department for a panel discussion on City business and land use issues. The event will be at Bow Creek Rec Center.

The VBCCO will host a two-hour mayoral candidate forum sometime in May 2024 with all the candidates. It is expected to be held at the Central Library Auditorium and will be a free but ticketed event as space is limited.

Speakers at the December 27 general meeting were Sheriff Rocky Holcomb and District 1 Councilman Chris Taylor.

Holcomb, and several of his deputies, shared a lot of interesting information on the City jail, including:

- -It costs about \$120 each day for each
- -63% of inmates have mental issues
- -A fentanyl detecting dog will be deployed in January 2024
- -Eight different enrichment programs are offered to inmates
- -There are no immigration holds at the jail, there are 133 known gang members
- -There are three jail buildings: "A" was built in 1976, "B" was built in 1992 and "C" in 2005.

Councilman Taylor gave updates on several items, including:

-Budget: our credit rating, school modernization, flood protection program, financing oceanfront festivals, several "needs" projects for updating/rebuilding including the LETA (Law Enforcement Training Academy), the aquarium, and schools and Rudee Loop.

-TIP Fund: Taylor feels the fund, which has a \$53M balance, needs to be sunset and some monies returned to the general fund.

Point-in-Time Count of Homeless Population

Virginia Beach Housing & Neighborhood Preservation is asking for the public's help in identifying locations throughout the city where individuals have been observed living without shelter. The information will help guide staff during the street count of the 2024 Point-in-Time (PIT) Count of the homeless population.

Submit locations from a mobile device or computer through Jan. 9 using an online map tool at: www.SpeakUpVB.com/2024VBPITCount

Signs that an individual is living unsheltered include personal belongings left behind, a structure resembling a bed is present, individuals have been seen there on multiple occasions, etc. Location points should include the date observed and additional details to help describe the situation. The department is asking for visual observations only.
