#### October PAPCL Meeting Highlights

The September minutes were read and approved. The treasurer's report included the balance on hand, noting receipt of an insurance payout for the damaged neighborhood sign. Committee chairs also gave updates.

President Wall said the executive board reviewed our constitution and bylaws and proposed multiple updates to be voted on at the November 12 meeting, a copy will be emailed to members in good standing meaning dues are up-to-date - and the most significant change is a dues increase to \$25 from \$12. Dues have not changed since the league's creation in 1963. The December 10 meeting would again include a potluck holiday celebration.

Terri Gorman of Lynnhaven River Now, gave an informative presentation. Virginia Beach is an ecologically sensitive area that impacts two estuaries, and problems that occur are typically development driven along with habitat loss and excessive nutrients. Stormwater drains directly into waterways and with 40 thousands drains in the city, water quality can be improved with practices such as installing native plants, using rain barrels, cleaning pet waste and reducing fertilizer run off.

Public Works Engineer Michael Mundy said all projects are on schedule and invited everyone attend the Oct. 10 open forum for detailed project updates. He then fielded several questions.

Councilman Berlucchi spoke briefly as did District 3 challenger Cleon Jones. Windsor Woods Area Library has a new programs coordinator and adult programs are back on the calendar. The City has a new bookmobile!

Project Lifesaver is a national, proactive electronic tracking program used to assist locating individuals with disease related Alzheimer's or disorders, or those with Down's syndrome or Autism. The Virginia Beach Police Department, partnership with Project Lifesaver, launched a planned response to all missing persons at-risk and others with special needs that may become lost. VBPD has teams of trained officers and special tracking equipment to help locate missing persons who are enrolled in Project Lifesaver

Project Lifesaver uses a personalized transmitter, powered by a small battery that emits a constant radio signal 24 hours a day. Once the police are advised that a person is missing, officers identify the signal using a specialized directional antenna and are able to track the missing person. This equipment is used on foot, in cars and also by air providing maximum cover and capability for search efforts for several miles using the tracking equipment. The average recovery time is less than 30 minutes.

All program operation costs are covered by donations, and the only cost a client's family or caregiver may incur is for lost or damaged equipment. For more information, contact VBPD Project Lifesaver coordinator: MPO Jason Karangelen (757) 385-4760, Jkarange@vbgov.com.

## Two-Hour Free Parking at the Oceanfront Resumes Nov. 1

Residents and visitors can enhance their oceanfront experience with free parking in <u>selective</u> areas along Atlantic Avenue for up to two hours between Nov. 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025.

During this five-month period, two-hour free parking will be available between 11 a.m. and 11 p.m. Areas for eligible parking will be marked with signage, rather than painted on the street. There is also free metered parking at on-street spaces (except for the 300 blocks of 24th 1/2 and 25th Streets) and at all municipal parking surface lots.
