### **VBCCO Mayoral Forum**

On September 23, the Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO) hosted a mayoral forum with all five candidates present. An initial estimate had 275 citizens attending.

VBCCO President Rick Boyles and Executive Board members conducted the forum, asking questions posed in advance by the registrants. Several volunteers assisted that night in many roles, from getting attendees checked in and distributing candidate campaign information to videotaping the forum.

## **September PAPCL Meeting Highlights**

-A City rep gave an update on the new Bow Creek pump station and pipe installation, noting nearby homes will receive a preconstruction survey notice, and there will be traffic diversions once construction begins.

-Councilman Berlucchi spoke about the neighborhood sign replacement he was able to secure; traffic concerns caused by the S. Plaza Trail stormwater project work and signal light adjustments; and responded to several questions on various topics.

-Michael Mundy gave project updates for our area, including the Old Forge Rd project should be done by the end of the year; all four tide gates at Mt. Trashmore are in, top decking is being built; the project completion date of April 2025.

-Windsor Wood Library is accessible during construction.

-Treasurer's report noted five new members joined at the June picnic. Our balance on hand is \$3777.76, including the \$1100 insurance payout.for the neighborhood sign damaged last year.

# Amazon Connect – The City's New Non-Emergency Call System

Earlier this year, the implemented what is said to be its first public-facing AI (artificial intelligence) solution — a call diversion tool called Amazon Connect. The main goal is to reduce the number of nonemergency and informational calls managed by live agents who also answer higher priority 911 calls. In turn, this would reduce hold times for non-emergency line callers and increase the availability of agents for true emergency calls.

Residents can dial the City's nonemergency line, 757-385-5000, and request help in their own words, and the natural language processing of the system will answer their question directly, transfer them to a live agent for help, or send them relevant information via text message. A data collection trial was held to develop a list of common call types guided by the actual language used to make the voice responses requests. and relevant links to the City's website. As more residents interact with the system, it will "learn" based on interaction and refine answers over time to deliver the most accurate information possible.

In the first month after the service went live, 36% of all incoming calls to the non-emergency line were handled completely by Amazon Connect or transferred to more appropriate departments while 3% of calls were identified as likely emergencies and prioritized above other calls. Callers reported shorter hold times and 911 telecommunicators reported that live calls were generally for more complex situations that required their intervention.

## **Draining Your Pool the Right Way**

Summer has drawn to an end and so has pool season. It's important to close your pool the right way to enjoy future pool seasons, and not create other problems. The City recommends you dechlorinate your pool by letting water stand untreated for a week (you can add sodium thiosulphate to break it down faster); check the pH and only drain clear water (pH should be between 6.5 and 8.5 before draining); and drain pool water into well vegetated areas on your property as it will help further dechlorinate on the way to the storm drain.

Chlorinated and salt water from pools that are discharged into storm drains pollute as almost all storm drains pipe directly to the nearest river or bay, harming both aquatic life and the environment.
