The Travail of Religious Liberalism: My Epic Fall after Visiting the Hindu Dhakeshwari Temple in Dhaka, Bangladesh

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Although my family and I are Buddhist, we are very liberal in religious matters and so I was exposed to all religions since my childhood. Although aching in multiple places and with sores in my arms and legs especially, I was man enough to hide my discomfort and kept all my professional engagements throughout the day as if it was business as usual.

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
