Dr Sir:

With Reference to the
liability of the D. & H. Co. to maintain the bridge
near the Barker stone, If it was a public road
when the Canal was built, the Company must
build and maintain the Bridge, On the other
hand, if there was not a public road at that
point and the Company built the bridge
for their own convenience, and the road
afterwards became a public one, either by use
or in any other way, I think the cost of
maintaining the bridge would fall upon
the borough, and in either case, if that is a
public highway, the borough must (if the
Company does not) keep the bridge safe,
and if the Company is liable to maintain
it, the borough would have a right of action
over against the Company, But before doing
anything, you had better notify the Company
to repair the bridge, This notice I will give Mr.
Rose, at once.

The Year 1890. J. H. Levine, President, stated that he would now, his time of Office having expired, be would retire, last before doing so. Wished to thank the Council for the Uniform Courtesy shown him, as presiding Officer of the Council, also, not forgetting the ^{pleasant} relations that had existed between himself and the Council, during the past year.

President Levine, then had a communication from Geo. Purdy in regard to who was eligible to hold the office of Secretary of the Town Council of the Borough of Crawley.

The following is a copy of Mr Purdy's letter.
The Act of 1874 provides that, "No person who shall be a member of the City Council, guardians of the Poor" &c shall at the same time be a salaried officer under the same or any of them, "again;" "No member of Council of any City shall be eligible to any office *** directly chosen by Councils *** during the term for which he shall have been elected." Now this Act is silent as to Borough Councils, and does not apply to them unless it be by implication. On a hasty examination of the law I gave it as my opinion once that this precluded you from acting as Secy, when a member of the Council - But upon a careful examination of the law, I am of the opinion that there is nothing to prohibit the board from choosing one of their own members as Secretary. I do not however, think this rule would apply to the office of Treasurer,
