The object of Special Meeting, was, for the Council
to take action, on communication received from
Mr. Geo. S. Purdy, Atty. for Borough. The following is the text
of the Communication, Mr. Rose, claims the Bridge
is not so high, as their others. But says they are going
to raise their others, I do not think they will touch the
Bridge, but they may ask the Court for a Mandamus,
to compel the Bd. officers to raise it. And if the
bridge should remain it, you would have to comply
or appeal to the Supreme Court, this would cost
more than to raise the Bridge. Mr. Rose says he
thinks if the bridge were raised the depth of the
middle beams it would be sufficient, and that he
thinks, it would then be 12 ft above high water
mark. He says if you will raise it, he will run
a screw load of gravel down and leave it handy
for you to fill the roadway at the end.

On motion, C. S. Armstrong, seconded by C. H. Schardt,
that this Council will not raise said bridge, unless
compelled to by order of the Court, approved.
