Reading the logs from our nightly patrols over the past three months, I can gratefully report that the liveliest aspect of the nightlife in our neighborhood comes from our furred and feathered friends: foxes, raccoons, coyotes, flying squirrels, and owls.

Other less welcome nightlife, however, includes thefts of license plates (garage your vehicles if you can) and persistent illegal parking of commercial vehicles. Dusk-time dog walkers



are observed without adequate reflective clothing: this is more hazardous than it appears. Our patrols report that whereas the MVYC gate is always closed, the Mansion House gate seldom is. As the summer months approach, this is a potential trouble spot.

Budget and Finance Committee Report

2014 Fairfax County Budget

The 2014 Fairfax County (FC), full year (FY), proposed budget plan was released on March 5th, 2013. The Board of Supervisors advertised tax rate was issued at \$1.095 as suggested by County executive Long. The 2013 adopted rate was \$1.075. Therefore the ceiling for the adopted budget on April 30th, can be no higher, but the adopted rate can be lower.

So, on April 23th, the FY 2014 Board marked up the budget and decided on a 1 cent tax increase to \$1.085. The one cent increase will amount to about \$20.6 million in additional revenue or on average about a \$200.00 tax increase. The formal adoption of the budget will be on April 30th.

Highlights of the 2014 FY budget include a 2% increase in the FCPS transfer amount. The 2014 budget does not include any compensation increases for FC employees with the exception of public safety employees to maintain their salary scales. In addition, the total number of county staff positions will be reduced by a net of 41.

Expansion of the head start program remains unfunded with about 800 children on the waiting list. There are also concerns over federal funding being reduced or eliminated due to the sequestration.

Effects of Sequestration

In the Chairman's remarks for the fiscal 2014 mark-up, concern over the sequestration cuts is palpable. "Many of our County residents who are employed by the Federal government will have their paychecks reduced by as much as 10% to 20% when they are furloughed during the months ahead." The county is already seeing the effects in reduced sales tax collections.

At the Mt Vernon Council level, we continue to advocate for more transparency in the budget and better communication to FC residents. FC has numerous revenue sources including local taxes and state and federal transfers. Money ebbs and flows in these budgets due to the whims of elected officials at the state and federal level. In the meetings ahead we will be discussing, with county officials, how this money is tracked after a budget is passed.

I look forward to reporting the adoption of the FY 2014 Fairfax County Budget at our next meeting. The link to the Fairfax County Budget page is www.FairfaxCounty.gov/dmb/.

It's picnic time!

Public Safety

The good news is that longer hours of sunshine encourage more outdoor activities such as walking, jogging, bicycling and BBQ.. Please consider use of helmets when biking and equipping bikes with lights, bells and reflectors. Bike stores and sporting goods/outdoor stores have a great variety of after-market safety equipment for all types and sizes of bikes. Reflective belts, vests and arm/legbands are readily available. Joggers and walkers are encouraged to carry some ID , cell-phone, and small flashlight and/or whistle.

We need to be aware of fire safety when using BBQ grills. Be very careful near dwellings, garages and decks and when disposing of ashes. Fire-starter liquid is highly flammable The use of charcoal grills in a garage or dwelling is very dangerous due to carbon monoxide fumes and risk of fire.

There has been one very recent late afternoon incident of a parked vehicle losing a rear window to a BB . Such incidents run the risk of personal injury as well as significant economic costs including loss of work-time, FCPD response, window debris cleanup and repair/replacement. Report all vandalism and graffiti incidents to the FCPD.

Remember to keep parked vehicles and garages locked. Outdoor lighting with motion or light-level sensors is highly recommended

Be ready for emergencies- water, food, flashlights, batteries, first-aid kit, car plug in cell-phone chargers, battery-powered cell-phone chargers, hand-crank and/or battery powered radio with weather channels, etc.

Consider enrolling in the County's CERT course (free) run by the FC Fire and Rescue Department to learn self-help techniques in the event of natural or man-made hazards and disasters. Google (Fairfax County Community

Emergency Response Team) to learn more about the free program and how to enroll.
