Students received a Parent/Student handbook acknowledgment form last week. I encourage you to read the handbook before signing and returning the acknowledgement. You can find a copy on our website under Documents, or if you would prefer to look at a hard copy, you can request one from the office. I'd like to highlight changes regarding hair, jewelry and cosmetics: "Hairstyles should be combed, neat, and of natural color. Hair dye is not permitted. Boys haircuts should be above the eyebrow and collar. Stud earrings are allowed; however, hoops and dangle earrings are not permitted for safety reasons. Necklaces should be worn beneath shirts so that they cannot be pulled. Nail polish must be clear, beige, or light pink in color. Seasonal or bright colored nails are not permitted. Hair, jewelry, and cosmetics will be subject to the discretion of the administrator."

Beginning on Monday, students will be asked to remove dangle or hoop earrings, so please remind your child of this change. Necklaces will need to be tucked into shirts. Brightly colored nail polish can be removed in the office, if necessary. We have talked with students about this as well. Please


