Media Subscriptions- Families will be encouraged to utilize the Hallow app and Formed that are aligned with school initiatives via the Saints Weekly.



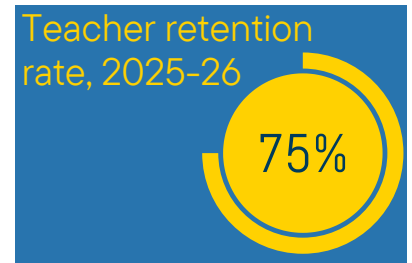
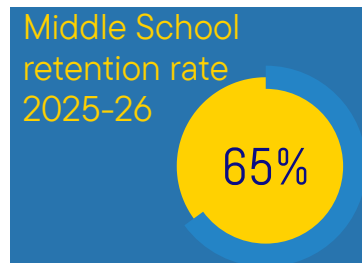
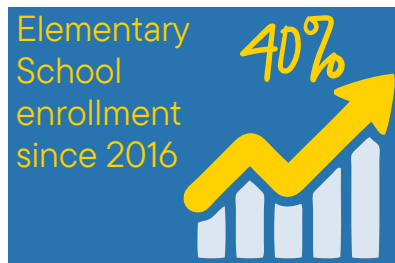

Yet, as we continue to grow, we recognize an opportunity to increase our retention level in both the middle school and our lower elementary faculty.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

A strong school community is built on a **shared understanding of mission and vision**. This year, we are deepening our efforts to clarify, communicate, and engage stakeholders in the direction of St. Augustine Catholic School.



Middle school retention- Retaining students after 5th grade is a key objective. Our faculty and staff is focused on promoting and sustaining a positive middle school climate, increasing leadership opportunities and collaboration for all students.



Investing in faculty stability- Faculty stability is a top priority. A formalized teacher mentor program has been developed and implemented with monthly topics for discussion. Mentorship will provide newer colleagues with continued support.



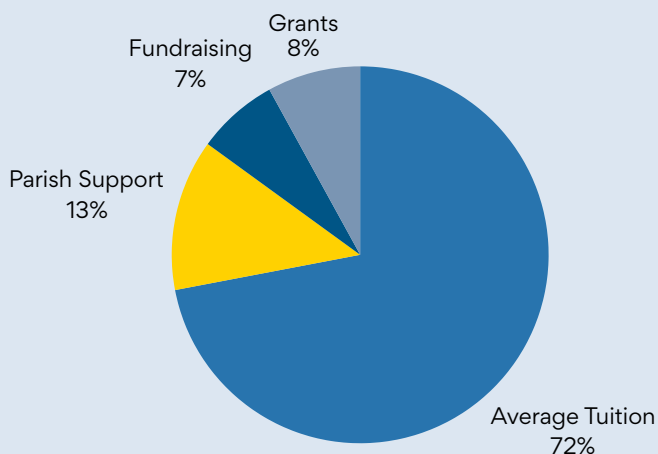

OPERATIONAL VITALITY: STRENGTHENING OUR FINANCIAL FUTURE

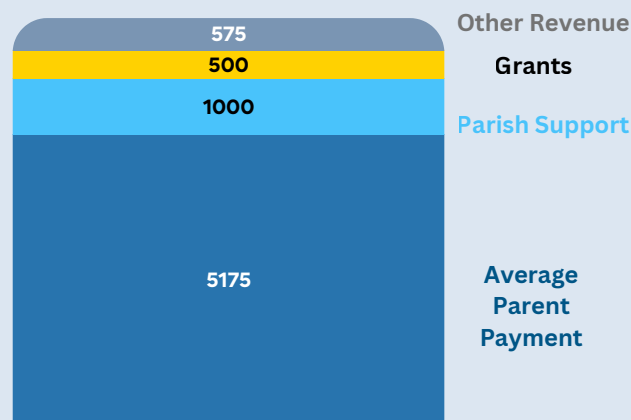
St. Augustine Catholic School is dedicated to responsible financial stewardship that ensures both affordability for families and long-term sustainability for the school and parish.

AREA OF FOCUS



We are taking strategic steps to fortify the financial foundation of St. Augustine Catholic School. Tuition assistance/scholarship efforts will become more purposeful to help support families as they navigate their financial commitments. Additionally, we will begin outreach efforts to alumni re-establishing their connection to the school and providing an opportunity for support both financially and as ambassadors. We are expanding our fundraising efforts to ensure additional funding to support our school's sustainability for the future.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

Financial strength is about more than just balancing numbers—it's about increasing affordability to current families, while ensuring that every student has access to an exceptional Catholic education for years to come.



Scholarships- An online giving link will be established, allowing donors to contribute to the school scholarship fund and/or sponsor a student. The parish envelope schedule will be adjusted, encouraging parish support for tuition assistance to help families afford a Catholic education.



Alumni Engagement- A development committee will work to create an updated alumni database, and plan/host alumni events promoting the school's mission. An alumni newsletter will be created and distributed periodically, along with an ongoing alumni giving campaign initiative.

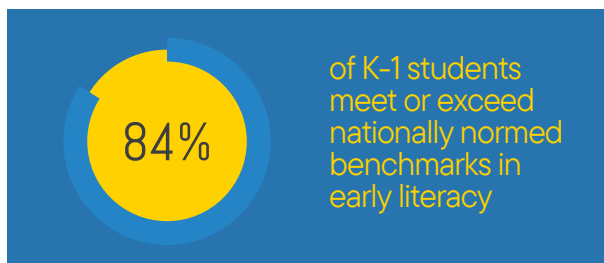
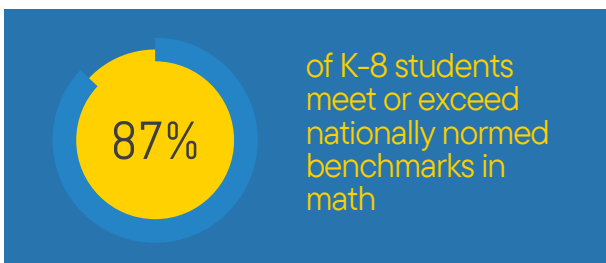


Fundraising- The school fundraising committee will evaluate each fundraising event, determine its effectiveness, and make adjustments to focus on those that generate the most revenue. Canvassing businesses will be re-established to obtain sponsorships, reducing event costs and increasing profit.

Our financial health is a reflection of our shared dedication. By uniting school alumni, families, donors, and the parish, we can foster both growth in and accessibility to Catholic education in our community.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: RAISING THE BAR FOR STUDENT GROWTH

Academic excellence is the result of a collective effort among educators, students, and families. Together, we are building a legacy of academic excellence, ensuring that every student at St. Augustine Catholic School is empowered to learn, grow, and succeed, thus preparing them for continued achievement in high school and beyond.



AREA OF FOCUS

✳ This year we are focusing on **early intervention** because it is the most effective prevention measure to reduce reading difficulty in the upper elementary grades. We know that reading is the foundation for long-term academic success and personal development. By the time students reach 3rd grade, focus shifts from learning to read to reading to learn. Early intervention is key in building a solid foundation of literacy skills.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

As we build upon our successes, we are strategically expanding the initiatives that have yielded the **greatest impact on student growth**, leading to **increased achievement** over time. We are committed to not just maintaining our momentum but accelerating it—ensuring that every classroom is a place where students are deeply engaged and learning is both rigorous and fun.



Literacy Coaching- Title I funds will be used to hire a skilled literacy coach to provide reading intervention instruction individually and in small groups to K-3 students who need extra help. The literacy coach will also assist new elementary teachers in implementing phonics instruction.



Professional Development Workshops- Title II funds will be prioritized to allow early elementary teachers to attend workshops or training to improve Tier I phonics and reading instruction.



Tutoring- If sufficient funding is available, Title I tutoring services will continue to be offered, increasing collaborative efforts among literacy coach, classroom teacher, academic interventionist, and tutor, thus increasing student growth. Final funding amounts will be released in January 2026.

By prioritizing growth through student-centered, targeted instructional practices, progress-monitoring, and collaborative instructional efforts, we will ensure that every student has the opportunity to grow and flourish academically.

SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING

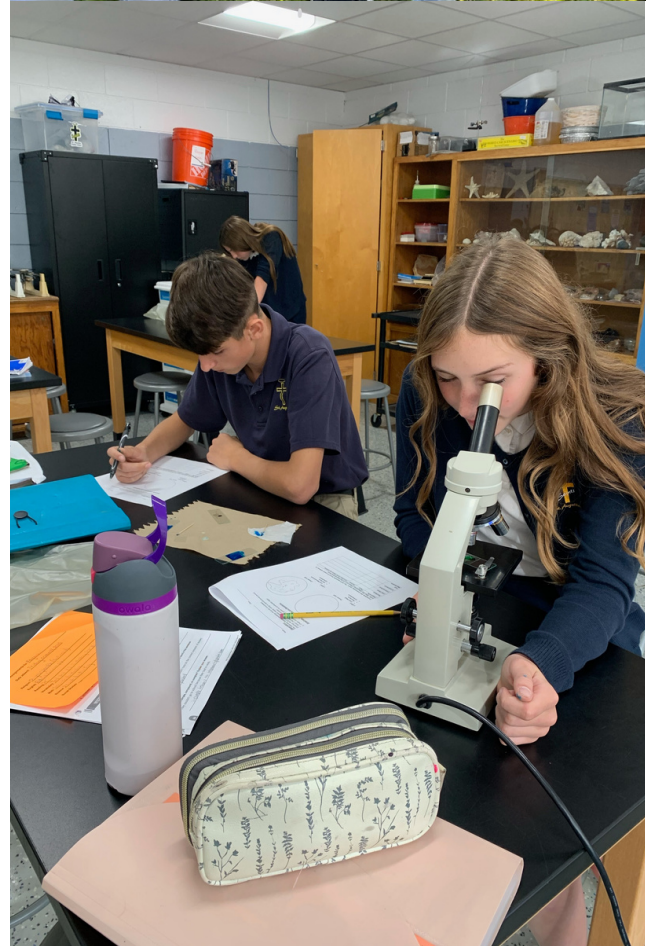
Encourage reading, celebrate academic growth, and reinforce faith at home through discussion and prayer.

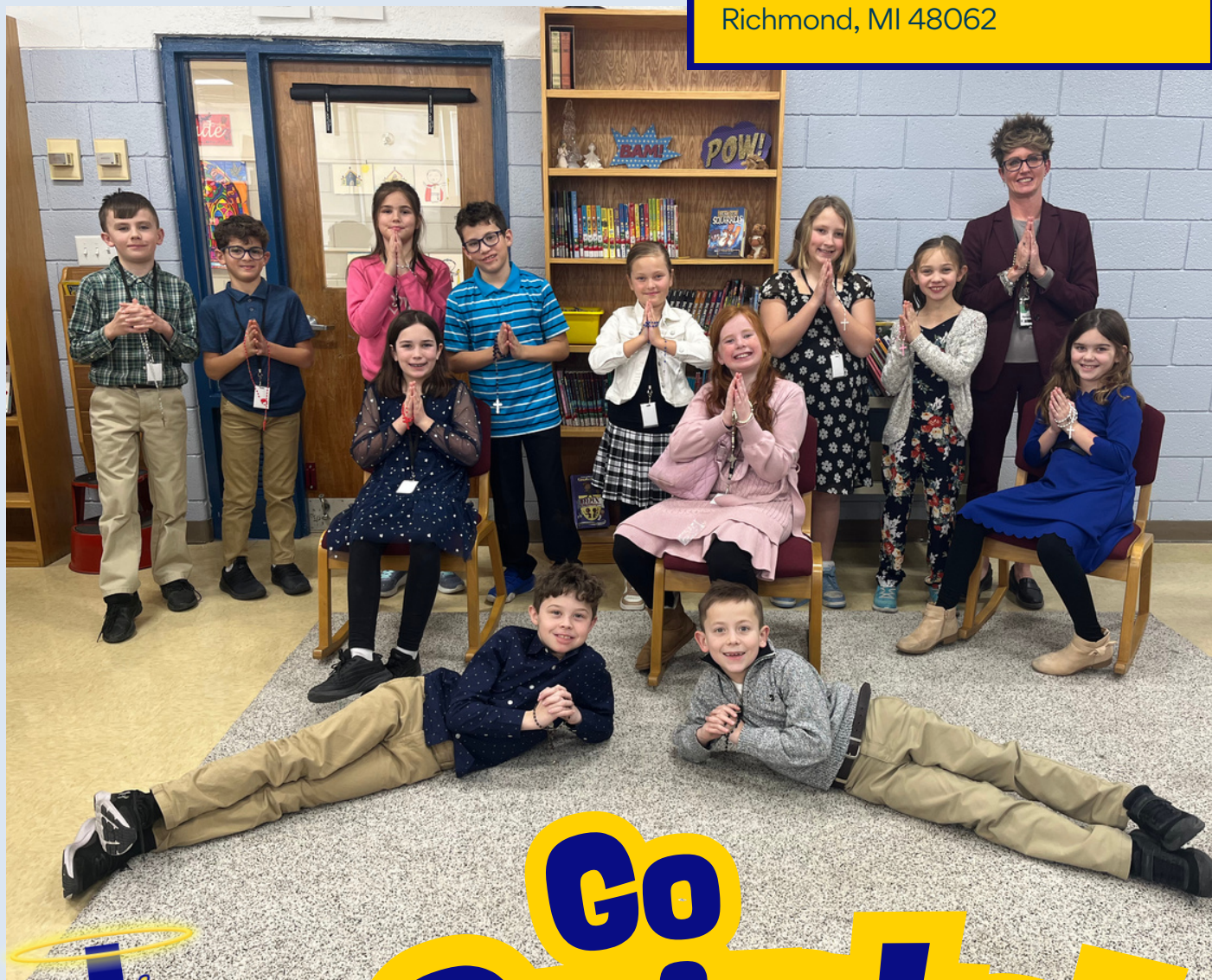
