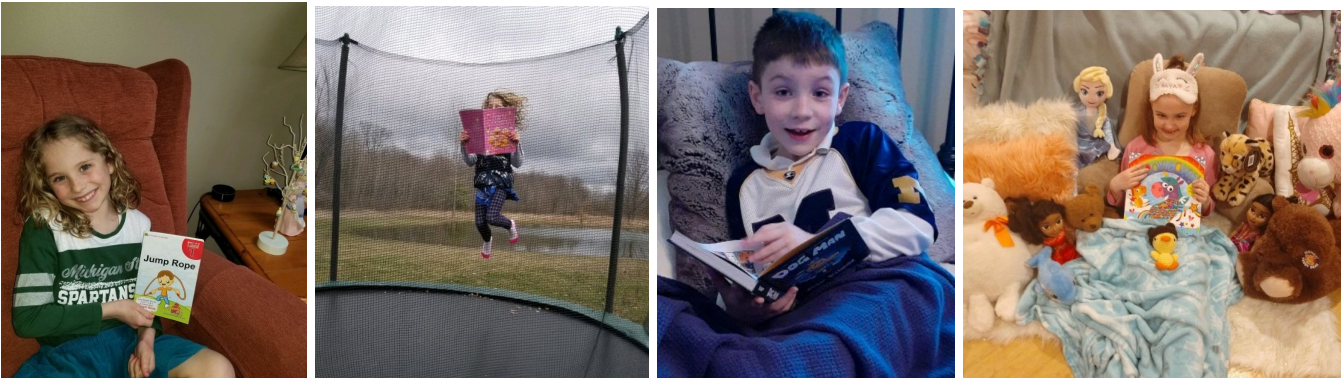

3rd grade: Third graders each chose a special reading spot and shared a picture.



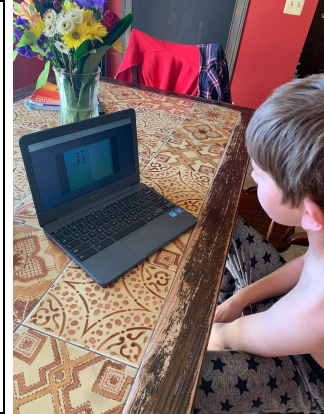
