I had an interesting opportunity last weekend to participate in a phone call with President Trump and over 600 other Catholic school leaders around the nation. The President spoke about his support for Catholic education and commended us for the work we are doing with our schools. Other speakers included Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop Gomez, Superintendents of Denver and LA Catholic schools, and representing the Archdiocese of Detroit was Sister Catherine Marie (Principal at St. Isaac Jogues in St. Clair Shores). Many of those who spoke clearly articulated to President Trump the importance of Catholic education and the need for support for our families. I was thankful to the President for taking the time to speak with us.

As time passes, we realize that some parents may be going back to work in the coming weeks. We also understand that this presents challenges in working on school work at home. In order to help you plan ahead, teachers will be posting their weekly checklists to their websites on Sundays. If your child's teacher emails assignments to you (this applies to the lower grades), teachers will also make every attempt to send these to you before Monday, to help you plan and print any necessary papers. I hope this is helpful. Remember that we are here to work with you, and we

are trying to keep parents in mind as we make plans. We are also beginning to plan for the need to collect textbooks and distribute your child's personal belongings to you. While we cannot determine a date on which we will do this yet, we are in the planning stages of this event and will provide more information as soon as we possibly can.

Over the course of the next two weeks, we will present a program mandated by the AOD called Circle of Grace. This program is designed to help children understand their own dignity in mind, body, and spirit. It is taught each year to all students in our schools and faith formation program. Since we are doing this during distance learning, teachers will be using a mix of teacher created videos and face-to-face instruction during weekly class Zoom or Google Meets. Please do the best you can to have your child attend these meetings so that they can participate in the discussions.
