Dear Catholic School Parents and Guardians,

Today, Governor Gretchen Whitmer issued <u>Executive Order 2020-35</u>, which extended the closure of all K-12 school buildings – public, private, and boarding – to all students for the remainder of the school year. Like her prior executive orders, this was done to help combat the spread of Coronavirus.

As I shared in my <u>letter</u> and <u>video</u> with you last week, all 87 Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Detroit are prepared to complete this academic year via distance learning instruction. As well, all <u>distance learning instruction will count</u> toward our instructional requirements and the education of our students will continue unabated.

In addition, and in recognition of the unique needs of each community, as Superintendent of Catholic Schools I am permitting chief administrators at each of our schools to shorten their respective academic year if and when called for by the local situation. Any decision by a school to take this action will be communicated by your school's chief administrator in the coming weeks.

Archbishop Vigneron and I appreciate your patience and understanding. If and when additional developments occur, the Archdiocese of Detroit and your local school will communicate those with you in a timely way.

Invoking Blessed Solanus Casey's famous phrase, "we thank God ahead of time" for a successful end to the Coronavirus situation. In addition to exercising prudent judgment during these times, I ask that you join the faithful around the archdiocese in prayer for an end to Coronavirus. As Archbishop Vigneron has said, "people of prayer are never helpless – never hopeless."
