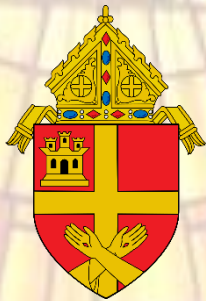

- St. Peter Claver was born at Verdu, Catalonia, Spain, in 1580, of impoverished parents descended from ancient and distinguished families. He studied at the Jesuit college of Barcelona, entered the Jesuit novitiate at Tarragona in 1602 and took his final vows on August 8th, 1604. In 1610, he landed at Cartagena (modern Colombia), the principle slave market of the New World, where a thousand slaves were landed every month. After his ordination in 1616, he dedicated himself by special vow to the service of enslaved people of the African diaspora - a work that was to last for 33 years. He labored unceasingly for the spiritual nourishment of enslaved Africans and the abolition of the slave trade.

- *Fratelli Tutti* (2020) *On Fraternity and Social Friendship*

- This encyclical from Pope Francis invites the Church to live out the call to universal fraternity and social friendship. The third encyclical of his pontificate, *Fratelli Tutti*, offers “a way of life marked by the flavor of the Gospel” (no. 1) and shares a vision for humanity that Pope Francis has emphasized throughout his papacy: “It is my desire that, in this our time, by acknowledging the dignity of each human person, we can contribute to the rebirth of a universal aspiration to fraternity. Brotherhood between all men and women” (no. 8). The Encyclical was inspired by St Francis, as was the Pope’s second Encyclical, *Laudato si’*, on the care of our common home, published in 2015. - *Laudate Deum (2023) Praise God*
 - This Apostolic Exhortation from Pope Francis is a short sequel his 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si'*, where he named the need to take greater care of our common home. He covers several subjects from the use of technology to the role of international politicians, but the overarching theme is one of urgency, with the Pope suggesting more needs to be done quickly, to tackle climate change. The Pope is quick to challenge sceptics on climate change and global warming, pointing out that “the overwhelming majority of scientists specializing in climate” acknowledge the phenomenon, while “only a very small percentage seek to deny the evidence”. Francis bluntly states that “our responses have not been adequate.” *Laudate Deum* stresses the need for us to act quickly or face “immensely grave consequences.” Francis notes that Western nations have a responsibility to lead the way on climate change.
