New Grant Awarded:

We are thrilled to share that CAC received **\$4,366.35** from **Enterprise Car Rentals**. Even better, this grant came with no restrictions, giving us flexibility to put the funds toward the most pressing needs of underserved children.

The Grant Writing Process:

The grant writing subcommittee stayed hard at work this summer. Multiple meetings led to the submission of a **\$20,000 grant application** to the **Episcopal Church of St. Mary Magdalene and St. Martin**. The Light of the World Clinic is a community-based volunteer medical clinic providing free primary and specialty healthcare, screenings, diagnoses, medical treatments, and counseling to economically disadvantaged and uninsured residents of Broward County. For the past 35 years, the clinic has proudly served the community, making quality healthcare accessible to those most in need.

Last year alone, 18,125 family members received care thanks to the dedication of volunteer physicians from a wide range of specialties, who generously donate their time, knowledge, and expertise. Through strong partnerships within the community, patients not only receive general medical care but also access to advanced specialty treatments beyond the scope of the clinic. The need for quality healthcare for the children underrepresented in this population is great. CAC is proud to support such a vital cause.



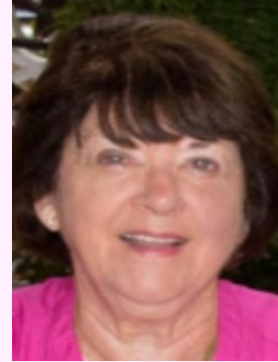

Organization Report

Reporting Period - August 1st, 2024 - July 31st, 20205

2024–2025 Fiscal Year Wrap-Up: Our fiscal year ended on **July 31, 2025**, with strong results. The Club budgeted **\$150,900** to support **25 organizations**, and we spent **\$149,750.30**. The remaining **\$1,149.70** was returned to the general fund—an excellent reflection of both careful stewardship and maximized impact.

Special Request Fund: The Special Request Fund, with a budget of **\$16,000**, awarded **\$15,849.02** to **11 partner organizations**. These funds made a direct difference by covering needs such as: Car seats, Program sponsorships, Financial assistance, Exams and eyeglasses, Food gift cards, and School supplies.

The Impact: 14,000 Children Helped: The numbers are in, and they’re inspiring: during 2024–2025, **14,000 children** were helped through CAC’s support. This remarkable figure reflects the generosity, dedication, and teamwork of our entire community.

Amended Records Retention and Destruction Policy of Children's Aid Club

In accordance with Florida Statutes 496.418 and 617.1601, Children's Aid Club ("CAC") shall retain the following records for a period of three (3) years:

- (1) By-Laws and all amendments
- (2) Minutes of all members' meetings and records of all actions taken by members without a meeting
- (3) Written communications to all members, including the financial statements furnished
- (4) List of the names and addresses of its current directors and officers.

At the end of three years, items 2 through 4 shall be destroyed.

Financial records for all expenditures shall be retained for a period of seven (7) years. This includes check requests and/or credit card forms and related receipts which shall be maintained by the liaisons as to Organizations and by the Treasurer as to all Individual requests and Club expenses.

CAC will maintain the following records permanently:

- (1) Audit reports from independent audits
- (2) Checks
- (3) Determination Letter from the IRS and correspondence relating thereto
- (4) Year-end Financial Statements
- (5) Insurance Policies
- (6) Minutes of board meetings and annual meetings of members
- (7) Tax returns

Calling All Liaisons,

Please review your financial records for your organization. If you have records dating back to 2018-019 (7+years), under the Retention and Destruction policy adopted last October, 2024, you are permitted to shred all financial information such as, check requests, supporting receipts/invoices, and correspondence.

If you have records for an organization that you are no longer the liaison, please forward that information to the new liaison for safe-keeping.

If you keep only digital files, please create backup systems, such as icloud storage, G-drive, or a USB Flash Drive (thumb Drive). Thank you!
