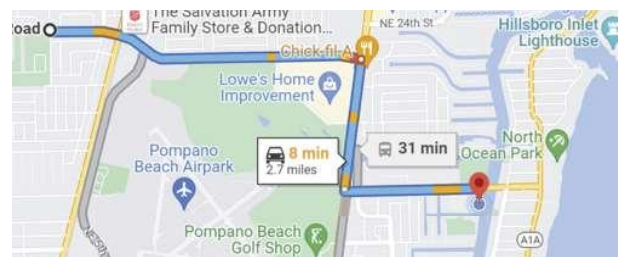

Children's Aid Club

In accordance with Florida Statutes 496.418 and 617.1601, Children's Aid Club ("CAC") shall retain the following records for a period of three (3) years:

- (1) By-Laws and all amendments
- (2) Minutes of all members' meetings and records of all action taken by members without a meeting
- (3) Written communications to all members, including the financial statements furnished
- (4) List of the names and addresses of its current directors and officers.

At the end of three years, items 2 through 4 shall be destroyed.

CAC will maintain the following records permanently:

- (1) Audit reports from independent audits
- (2) Checks
- (3) Determination Letter from the IRS and correspondence relating thereto
- (4) Year-end Financial Statements
- (5) Insurance Policies
- (6) Minutes of board meetings and annual meetings of members
- (7) Tax returns

Conflict of Interest Policy

Our Welfare Guidelines state that a recipient cannot be a family member of any active or auxiliary member of the Children's Aid Club ("CAC"). Specifically, the recipient cannot receive any assistance, whether in the form of money or in the form of in-kind services or goods if the recipient is related either by blood or marriage to any member of CAC. For purposes of this guideline, "family member" shall be defined as any person who is related by the same lineage and/or any person who stands in a legal or blood relationship to a CAC member, regardless of whether or not they reside together with the CAC member. The purpose of this guideline is to assure that there is no appearance of impropriety among or between members of CAC and potential recipients and to avoid any possible tax implications.

Recipient cannot be a "family member" as described above of any previous member of CAC unless a period of five (5) years or more has elapsed since such time that the member had been either an active or auxiliary member of CAC.

Donor Privacy Policy

Children's Aid Club ("CAC") will not sell, share or trade our donors' names or personal information with any other entity, nor send mailings to our donors on behalf of other organizations.

This policy applies to all information received by CAC, both online and offline, on any platform, as well as any electronic, written or oral communications.

To the extent any donations are processed through a third-party service provider, our donors' information will only be used for purposes necessary to process the donation.

Whistleblower Protection Policy

Children’s Aid Club (“CAC”) requires directors, officers and members to observe high standards of business and personal ethics in the conduct of their duties and responsibilities. As representatives of CAC, we must practice honesty and integrity in fulfilling our responsibilities and comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

Reporting: This Whistleblower Policy is intended to encourage and enable members and others to raise serious concerns internally so that CAC can address and correct inappropriate conduct and actions. It is the responsibility of all board members, officers and volunteers to report concerns about violations of CAC’s code of ethics or suspected violations of law or regulations that govern CAC’s operations.

No Retaliation: It is contrary to the values of CAC for anyone to retaliate against any board member, officer, employee or volunteer who in good faith reports an ethics violation, or a suspected violation of law, such as a complaint of discrimination, or suspected fraud, or suspected violation of any regulation governing the operations of CAC. An individual who retaliates against someone who has reported a violation in good faith is subject to discipline up to and including removal from CAC.

Reporting Procedure: CAC has an open door policy and suggests that members share their questions, concerns, suggestions or complaints with the Membership Chair. If you are not satisfied with her response, you are encouraged to speak with the President or Vice President. Any one of the above individuals are required to report complaints or concerns about suspected ethical and legal violations in writing to the CAC’s Board or a designated committee comprised of three Board members, who has the responsibility to investigate all reported complaints. The Membership Chair will advise the Board of all complaints and their resolution and will report at least annually to the Treasurer compliance activity relating to accounting or alleged financial improprieties.

Accounting and Auditing Matters: CAC shall immediately notify the Audit Committee/Finance Committee of any concerns or complaint regarding corporate accounting practices, internal controls or auditing and work with the committee until the matter is resolved.

Acting in Good Faith: Anyone filing a written complaint concerning a violation or suspected violation must be acting in good faith and have reasonable grounds for believing the information disclosed indicates a violation. Any allegations that prove not to be substantiated and which prove to have been made maliciously or knowingly to be false will be viewed as a serious disciplinary offense and may result in loss of membership.

Confidentiality: Violations or suspected violations may be submitted on a confidential basis by the complainant. Reports of violations or suspected violations will be kept confidential to the extent possible, consistent with the need to conduct an adequate investigation.

Handling of Reported Violations: The Membership Chair will notify the person who submitted a complaint and acknowledge receipt of the reported violation or suspected violation. All reports will be promptly investigated and appropriate corrective action will be taken if warranted by the investigation.

Pam Ferrante: Family of 4 children whose dad lost his job, move to Florida to live with family. The family kicked them out and they finally got a home of their own. They were able to shop at Morning Day Solutions with the \$500 grant for household items. We have \$123 left.

Preparing 2024-2025 Budget: We need the applications for each organization. If you are the liaison, please be sure to apply for it now so you can get your allocation.

We have two new organizations that are applying to be an organization of CAC. We currently have 25 organizations and have 2 new ones applying. We potentially need 3 new liaisons (1 is stepping down and 2 new organizations may need to be filled).

Pompano Beach Middle School is in need of a liaison

NEW: JAFCO- We have supported them in the past with special finds but they are asking to be considered as one of our organizations.

Whispering Pines Center- They are the sister school to the Cross Creek School that we already support.

We need to make sure we can support our organizations not just financially but also with a member liaison.

Belinda applied for the ALDI gift card grant up to \$5,000.

We are still waiting for our date for the McMahan Mix & Mingle. We are thinking sometime towards the beginning of the year when it isn't the rainy season.

We want to organize tabling at Walmart. We were offered the opportunity and it will look good when we continue to ask for grant funds. Considering handing out a flyer to those going in that will list items we want/need so they can buy while shopping.

Our Social Bunch Sip and Shop: Sands Harbor- We collected diapers and wipes which have since been disbursed. Sands offered us the opportunity to utilize their event space at no charge and we pay per consumption.

Jessica June - Liaison, Reba A and Carole F

The Mogollon family application was sent to us in December 2023 asking for assistance with past due rent, utilities, car insurance and possible help with food and gas cards. Before we were able to help organization stepped up and paid several months rent. This is a single mom with a 13 year old daughter undergoing cancer treatment. Her daughter's mental health at the time was a concern so her mom felt she should be getting work in the home and thus falling behind in paying her bills.

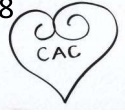

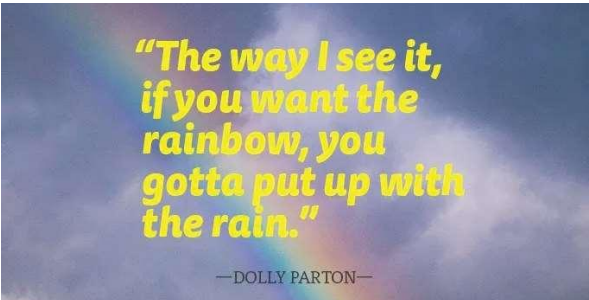
