



We envision a world where People, Bees and Produce live in a balanced and mutually harmonious relationship:


- People take care of bees and pollinators, using less pesticides and providing habitat and a healthy environment; and bees provide honey, beeswax and other hive products for human consumption.

- People plant, cultivate and harvest produce, flowers and animal fodder; and the plants provide nourishment for humans.



Revenue v. Expenses


Revenue

Revenue was from direct donations from individuals and corporations, and program income from events such as honey sales at the Jewish Nevada celebration. We also received an \$8,000 grant from the Foxwynd Foundation.




Expenses

Expenses include grants and donations we give others, as well as operating expenses we incur such as insurance and software fees. Since we are an all-volunteer organization, we had no salary expense in 2024. With Administrative expenses stubbornly at 33%, our goal for 2025 is to reduce that slice of the pie to 25% or less.

HSBF gives according to how we receive. In 2024, almost 3/4 of our revenue was from non-local sources; and for the first time, we received no donations from outside the U.S.
