The Beginning of IH

The International Harvester Co. was formed to tackle the markets of the world, which it did with great success. It was formed from 5 large harvester companies and a few smaller ones. In 1902 it controlled 85% of the agricultural market. The company dominated that industry until the late 1950's.

The company's early roots grew from Cyrus Hall McCormick Harvester Company. McCormick built the first successful grain reaper. He was very driven for success and alienated many people along the way. He brought greater success to the McCormick Company during the Harvester Wars of 1880. The competition was driven from the field by quality equipment, outrageous sales pitches and the first sales people.

Annual Farm Toy Show Meeting Report

"Braggin' Rights," our chapter's annual farm toy show was conducted at the clubhouse February 13, 2022 and was a fun event with eight members setting up impressive displays taking up space of six tables reserved for the occasion.

All large displays this year, they showed a good variety of farm toys some showed for the first time. Members bringing their toys included Dick and Carol Monkelbaan of Sheldon, Louie Buckner of Medina, Gene Preston of Greece, Terry Page of Perry, Daryl Heiby of Perry, Doug Harke of Geneseo, Brad Banks of Clarence, and Butch Christ of Kendall.

As expected the highlight of the show was when our own nationally known famous writer and collector, farm toy expert and member, Doug Harke of Geneseo began to speak. For 45 minutes he amazed us with his knowledge of numerous toys he brought for show and tell. Stories of toy sales and values from his decades of hosting annual Geneseo toy shows and auctions with the Boy Scouts are an education in themselves.

Doug explained how the plastic Product Miniature M tractors were produced during wartime when metal was not available in 1945. A plastic flare box wagon was also offered. We learned that Ertl's first tractor was a 1954 Farmall 400 with split rims, and about a new in-the-box tractor that sold for \$2200. After those split rims failed as kids played with them, Ertl put a different rim on them. Doug says the value of a toy depends on its condition and rarity. Speaking of 400's, more than once during Doug's lecture he humorously referenced overkill of my actual Farmall 400 pulling my little No. 8 McCormick two-bottom hydraulic trailer plow on my farm.

Who would have guessed there are 11 variations of the 10-20 tractor? Another lesson covered the Farmall 560 with fast hitch and lever. Also of great interest to all in attendance was Doug speaking of the 1955 line of Tru-Scale International Harvester trucks. He held up a 1966 Loadstar dealer tilt bed with cab interior and elaborated on its features. Interesting to me because I have one of those.

We also got a bit of history on the famous IH "Red Baby" trucks of the 1930's, and Doug showed his dandy repro. After listening to Doug talk I believe I was not the only IH toy collector there that went home with a greater appreciation and understanding of what is in our collections. Thanks to everyone who took the time to gather some toys and bring them for all to enjoy. A page of photos is included.

The IH company was founded with harvesting equipment with the threshers being expensive pieces of equipment for their time, going well over \$1000 in the 1920's and 30's.

Cyrus died in 1884 and his grandson Cyrus McCormick III was then leading the McCormick Harvesting Machine Company. In July 1902 the IH company was formed from Deering Harvester, Milwaukee Harvester, Plano Harvester and several smaller harvester companies. The company boasted \$120 million in capital assets and markets around the world.

The first machine to be called a tractor was an internal combustion powered unit built by a couple of Wisconsin engineering students, Charles Hart and Charles Parr which was introduced in 1902.

IH began experimenting with tractors in 1902 and officially threw its hat in the ring in 1907 by making 150 crude, friction -driven tractors.


The passing of Stewart Paquette March 12, 2022 leaves a huge void in IH circles across our great land. He went from owning Paquette Paving Company to establishing himself in the Leesburg, FL community by promoting the remembrance and preservation of the International Harvester Company and its many products. In his so-called retirement years he spent his time collecting and restoring IH tractors, trucks, signs, and the like which are on display at his Paquette's Historical Farmall Tractor Museum. Open year around, the tractor barn, gift shop - complete with red pylon, show barn with live entertainment, great food, and a herd of Buffalo grazing in the distant ranch, is picture perfect. In his 83 years, Stew became owner to one of the largest collections of International Harvester machinery in the world, known as "Stew's Stuff."

Stew was a pillar in the International Harvester community for which he hosted an annual tractor event that attracted huge crowds. His love affair with International Harvester Collectors Club was obvious when Florida Chapter 27 and its president Charlie Stevenson held his club's annual state show at Stew's place. Stew was also coordinator to the "Running of the Red" traveling event that brought a caravan of tractors for miles to be marveled at The Villages town squares, a nearby retirement community.

The legacy of Stewart Paquette continues in the hearts of all of those who were fortunate enough to know and love him. His awesome collection of everything IH in a perfect Florida setting is unmatched by any other museum. Each time I would go there was like seeing it and meeting him for the first time. His open arms welcome never got old. If there is any comfort to all this it is that he is back together this time for eternity with his beloved Helen. His passing breaks our hearts. It means a painful loss of friendship, talent and knowledge of the International Harvester Company and all its products. His museum proudly displays one of our NYS IHC Chapter 35 shirts with our logo.

A Celebration of Life was held at the Museum Show Barn in Leesburg, FL on Saturday, April 2, 2022. I and others from far away tuned into the fitting live-streamed program for Stew. It was very special to be part of the service and hear family members and friends pay tribute to this great individual.

Go rest high on that mountain Stewart Paquette. Your work on earth is done. Now you can line up and run those red tractors you know so well in God's Everlasting Kingdom until we can all meet again one day.
