



RAFFLE COMMITTEE FORMED



INTERNATIONAL HARVESTER DEALERS OF THE PAST

One of my fun research projects ongoing now for at least 10-years has been documenting Past International Harvester Dealers of New York State. Gathering names and locations has been fun while at events like winter conventions and roundups. Another productive resource has been old dealer match folders, dealer decals on tractors and implements, advertising items such as rulers, pens, and brochures with dealer names stamped on them.

I thought I had been doing well until recently when George Snyder of Victor, NY, a longtime friend who once worked for an IH dealer emailed me a 59-page listing. Suddenly my work is done and reading through this list of NYS past IH dealers is fun and entertaining. Finding dealer names, etc., that family and farm neighbors dealt with during their farming years is a delight. Early on before IH came up with the corporate prototype red pylon trademark dealership building, they apparently would allow any corner garage, car or truck dealer of any brand, service station, even hardware stores, feed and farm supply stores, produce and fertilizer dealers, to become a dealer and sell IH farm equipment, IH appliances, Scout vehicles, etc. It is difficult understanding the combination of Packard Automobiles and Farmall tractors, or Pontiacs & Scouts in the same showroom.
