<u>Reading of Minutes:</u> deferred; minutes were in the previous newsletter. Motion to approve printed notes made by Ray, seconded by Carol; the motion was carried.

<u>Treasurer's report</u>: We had \$710 in income, expenses of \$420 to National and \$298.10 to our website domain. There is currently a balance of \$17,744. Motion to approve treasurer's report made by Anita DeGlopper, seconded by Alan Mason. Carried.

<u>Membership Secretary Report</u>: Renewal started out strong but dwindled; 187 members have currently renewed. 37 have not; Gene placed calls to those members. National dues are increasing by \$5 effective 01.01.23; memberships received after that date will see the increase. At this time, National is not permitting any multi-renewals; our renewals can only be for one year. Motion to approve increase made by Dick, seconded by Jay; motion carried. **Committee reports:** None at this time.

<u>Past presidents:</u> We would like to welcome and recognize Anita DeGlopper, Ray DeGlopper, and Dale Rissinger. <u>Old Business:</u>

- ➤ At our last meeting, the BOD approved an internal audit of our books. Patty Feeney and Dick Dahmer will work with the treasurer and plan to conduct the audit at our 02.12.2023 meeting.
- At the last meeting, a fundraiser was approved by the BOD. Director Dale acquired a pedal tractor for \$300 as a fundraiser project. Motion was made by Dave and seconded by Dick to go ahead with the fundraiser as soon as we can get a committee chairperson and get tickets printed. Gene emailed members asking for a volunteer to manage the fundraiser, and received a reply from member Jerry Taylor of Attica, New York. Jerry may select a couple of club members to help him with ticket printing, advertising, sales, and distribution to members. Thank you Jerry!
- State Show: Following discussion, the BOD agreed to designate the WNYG&SEA rally at Alexander, NY as our Annual State Show site. A two-thirds majority of members present is required from motion to pass, a call for a vote was made, and no members opposed. The motion carried and the Alexander Steam Show will be designated as our State Show.
- <u>Annual Membership Dues</u>: Many chapters are following National and increasing their dues by \$5 to ensure chapter income and pay bills for catered lunches and enjoy the activities, such as the bus trip taken to Chapter 17 a few years ago. # **31<sup>st</sup> ANNUAL IHC WINTER CONVENTION**

The 31st Annual IHC Winter Convention at Roanoke, VA. is now history and we made many new friends while there. This report will be brief so not to take away from my report I was asked to write for our national newsletter Harvester Highlights. They extended the deadline until the day the convention ended so I could get the group pictures and everything included and emailed to them from our hotel room.

The bus tour to the McCormick Farm in Raphine, Virginia was a highlight of the convention in my opinion. This is the actual site where 22-year-old Cyrus McCormick demonstrated the world's first mechanical reaper in the fields nearby to neighbors and onlookers on a hot July day in 1831. A grist mill and other structures still remain in working order. The family farm house is now a museum and main office.

The two days of morning and afternoon seminars always offered something of interest to everyone. *Properly Securing Equipment for Hauling* by John Roop had many important tips reinforced by photos of 3 large IH tractors shown totally destroyed and scattered into pieces when they were thrown off the trailer during a traffic mishap.

Thursday evening Vaughn Allen and Tom Clark talked excitedly on Building IH Trucks for 116 years. Friday evening my gathering of chapter presidents for a group photo took place. Then the IH Auction lasted for 2 hours. Our own Tom Macauley was the successful bidder on a limitededition dealer piece, a 1/16 scale new 1987 7130 MFD Magnum tractor in the box. Each evening after scheduled events were finished a nice mix of chapter members convened in the large lobby area talking and laughing in a wonderful show of camaraderie, something President Bob Buxton remarked on during one of his talks. 
