*\*Only Certified, Kiln Dried firewood is allowed. It is easily accessible at Menards, Home Depot, most grocery stores and gas stations. If it doesn't read "Certified" on the label, don't buy it. The reason is this home sits in the middle of a large grove of Red Oaks. **Oak Wilt** can be devastating and is prevalent in this area.*

*\*It's common to come across a Fawn in the woods, depending on the time of year. Absolutely do NOT touch it. Take a picture and keep walking. It is not injured, it sits frozen in time, until Mom comes back at dark to feed. Just leave it, she will be back to get it.*

*\*Local channels are on **YoutubeTV***

*\*The cabin heats and cools more quickly with the ceiling fans ON.*

*\*High winds can show up out of nowhere, please be sure to secure the umbrella on the deck.*

*\*Please do not leave the propane running on the outdoor fireplace if you are not using it, the ignitor is in the kitchen.*

*\*Wildlife is best seen at sunup and sundown. Stay on the trails, be safe.*

*\*There are wild leeks, wild raspberries, morel mushrooms, hickory nuts, acorns, and ginseng in the woods.*

*\*If you use the grill please clean it when you are finished, wire brush is hanging on the deck.*

*\*The neighbor's dog is a harmless beagle. He doesn't stick around for more than a few minutes. He's just making sure everything is cool, then leaves. His name is Blue.*

*\*The “critter” that lives under the deck is a cottontail rabbit, please be polite to him. His name is MIKE, he lives here, and it seems he doesn’t like loud noises after 8pm.*

*\*Please clean up after your pets, inside and out, remember to check for dog rockets in the basement.*

*\*No Campfires Please*

*\*Yes, there are Deer Ticks and Poison Ivy in the woods, also Coyotes but it is very unlikely you will see one during the day.*

*\*The cleaning person does not clean outside so please be sure there is no dog hair left on the red cushions on the deck and please clean up around the fire pit.*

*\*Hiking trails start about 40 yards below the deck. We do not own any land East of Satterlee Road. It's unlikely you will run into any of the neighbors on our trails but say hello if you do. Stay on the trails, be safe.*

*\*There is a Leaf Blower, Stihl, which you can use to blow the deck after a storm. Prime it, turn the black dial all the way to the right and pull the cord.*

*\*Please be sure the propane tank is empty before you swap it out, check the gauge on the hose. How to reset a propane tank regulator:*

- 1. Turn the knob off on the grill*
- 2. Disconnect the hose from the tank*
- 3. Wait 15-30 seconds*
- 4. Reconnect the hose to the tank*
- 5. Slowly turn on the gas on the tank.*
- 6. Start the fire as usual.*

*\*First-aid Kits are in the Pantry and Bathroom*

*\*There is an air pump in the basement for basketballs, footballs, bike tires, whatever. It's on the shelf, west wall.*

\*When you leave, please be sure the oven is off, the ceiling fans are off, fireplaces are off.

\*This is not a hotel. It is our home. Please leave it in reasonably organized condition for our cleaning person.

\*When you leave, please drop your trash, and recyclables in the blue dumpster in the driveway.

\*DRIVE SAFELY. There are deer and horse drawn buggy's all over. Especially at night. Slow Down!
