The charity organised the **London Vigils against Hate Crime** between 2009-2012, after the death of lan Bayham (Oct 2009).

In 2012 the hate crime vigils evolved into **National Hate Crime Awareness Week**.

We deliver a programme of **Hate Crime Projects** including an annual **H.O.P.E. campaign** to raise awareness and keep tackling hate crime firmly on the national agenda.

30TH APRIL - SOHO

At 5 pm people gather at the Admiral Duncan on Old Compton Street.

At 6.10 pm there is a procession to St Anne's Gardens on Wadour Street.

Short service in the gardens, usually followed by drinks at the Admiral Duncan.
