Did you know a one-world currency is currently being established?

"The sky is falling," shouts Henny Penny, running in circles around the barnyard in the famous children's book. Children for generations have gotten a good laugh at her absurd reaction to a hit on the head by a falling acorn.

But intelligent men are running in circles prophesying that a tiny 1.5% increase in planet temperature means global disaster. Whether or not there is a real problem, the proposed solutions are scarier than the issues themselves.

In a July 2024 report titled, A World Call to Action, think tanks submitted what they believed to be the greatest issues facing humanity. Twenty-six entries make up the report and every single one declares that the sky is, indeed, falling. Topics included food shortages, social injustice, the spread of war, inadequate healthcare, and geographical instability.

In one entry, Professor Emeritus Augusto Lopez-Claros of the Global Governance Forum stated that we're moving toward a "future of accelerating climate change... and an economic paradigm that no longer delivers prosperity for all...." His solution includes creating an "Earth System Council" that has the authority "to pass binding legislation to protect our planetary environmental system and the common good it provides, with necessary mechanisms." That's One World Government!

In another entry, Julian Cribb, of the Council for the Human Future, discusses ten "mega risks" to humanity's survival. Among the entries are overpopulation, economic instability, and global warming. **His solutions include** population control, global "truth commission," and a one-world currency.

Of twenty-six entries, every single one that addresses global warming and economic instability suggests some form of one-world currency as a solution. Worldcoin, a Silicon Valley tech startup, is making it their mission to fill the "need."

The Orb

After raising a quarter of a billion dollars, Worldcoin introduced a working cryptocurrency and ID verification system in one shiny unit called the "Orb." The Orb is a high-tech metal ball that scans the iris in a person's eye, verifying their individuality much like a fingerprint. Upon sign-up, registrants receive a small amount of Worldcoin currency to use.



Worldcoin's goal is global acceptance of both the verification system and the currency. Their system effectively creates a scan-and-pay system that requires personal verification to buy or sell. Sound familiar?


Though privacy concerns have been raised over Worldcoin's Orb, the technology has also received praise. In a statement about the Orb, Charles Herber, a cybersecurity specialist, said, "Worldcoin is doing something really important by bringing to the forefront the value of identity and biometrics." When questioned about the potential of data misuse and general concern over the Orb, co-creator Alex Blania said they're focused on "explaining to people, that, actually, we're not going to steal your soul."

As nice as that sounds, the Bible clearly outlines what happens when a global government and one-world currency is established. There will be total control over every person, and death awaits those who refuse to along with the system. "The Perfect Target"

Russia cultivated Trump as asset for 40years-ex-KGB SPY

Editor's note: The following information in the article below comes from the book American Kompromat by journalist Craig Unger. The book was published in 2016, at the beginning of Donald Trump's first term as president. In the book, Yuri Shvets a former KGB agent claims Donald Trump was cultivated and placed in the White House by Communist powers working out of Moscow.



Donald Trump was cultivated as a Russian asset over 40 years and proved so willing to parrot anti-western propaganda that there were celebrations in Moscow, a former KGB spy has told the Guardian.

Yuri Shvets, posted to Washington by the Soviet Union in the 1980s, compares the former US president to "the Cambridge five", the British spy ring that passed secrets to Moscow during the second world war and early cold war.

Now 67, Shvets is a key source for American Kompromat, a book published eight years ago by journalist Craig Unger, whose previous works include House of Trump, House of Putin. The book also explores the former president's relationship with the disgraced financier Jeffery Epstein.

"This is an example where people were recruited when they were just students and then they rose to important positions; something like that was happening with Trump," Shvets said by phone from his home in Virginia.

Shvets, a KGB major, had a cover job as a correspondent in Washington for the Russian news agency Tass during the 1980s. He moved to the US permanently in 1993 and gained American citizenship. He works as a corporate security investigator and was a partner of Alexander Litvinenko, who was assassinated in London in 2006.

Trump appears on Russian Radar

Unger describes how Trump first appeared on the Russians' radar in 1977 when he married his first wife, Ivana Zelnickova, a Czech model. Trump became the target of a spying operation overseen by Czechoslovakia's intelligence service in cooperation with the KGB.

Three years later Trump opened his first big property development, the Grand Hyatt New York hotel near Grand Central station. Trump bought 200 television sets for the hotel from Semyon Kislin, a Soviet emigre who co-owned Joy-Lud electronics on Fifth Avenue.

According to Shvets, Joy-Lud was controlled by the KGB and Kislin worked as a so-called "spotter agent" who identified Trump, a young businessman on the rise, as a potential asset. Kislin denies that he had a relationship with the KGB.

Then, in 1987, Trump and Ivana visited Moscow and St. Petersburg for the first time. Shvets said he was fed KGB talking points and flattered by KGB operatives who floated the idea that he should go into politics. The ex-major recalled: "For the KGB, it was a charm offensive. They had collected a lot of information on his personality so they knew who he was personally. The feeling was that he was extremely vulnerable intellectually, and psychologically, and he was prone to flattery.

This is what they exploited. They played the game as if they were immensely impressed by his personality and believed this is the guy who should be president of the United States one day: it is people like him who can change the world. They fed him these so-called active measures soundbites and it happened. So it was a big achievement for the KGB active measures at the time."

Trump places ad

Soon after he returned to the US, Trump began exploring a run for the Republican nomination for president and even held a campaign rally in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. On 1 September, he took out a full-page advertisement in the New York Times, Washington Post and Boston Globe headlined: "There's nothing wrong with America's Foreign Defense Policy that a little backbone can't cure."

The ad offered some highly unorthodox opinion in Ronald Reagans's cold war America, accusing ally Japan of exploiting the US and expressing skepticism about US participation in Nato. It took the form of an open letter to the American people "on why America should stop paying to defend countries that can't afford to defend themselves".

The bizarre intervention was cause for astonishment and jubilation in Russia. A few days later Shvets, who had returned home by now, was at the headquarters of the KGB first chief directorate in Yasenevo when he received a cable celebrating the ad as a successful "active measure" executed by a new KGB asset.



"It was unprecedented. I'm pretty well familiar with KGB actives measures starting in the early 70s and 80s, and then afterwards with Russia active measures, and haven't heard anything like that or anything similar-until Trump became the president of this country-because it was just silly. It was hard to believe that somebody would publish it under his name and that it will impress real serious people in the west but it did and, finally, this guy became the president."

Trump's election win in 2016 was again welcomed by Moscow. Special counsel Robert Mueller did not establish a conspiracy between members of the Trump campaign and the Russians. But the Moscow project, an initiative of the center for American Progress Action Fund, found the Trump campaign and transition team had at least 272 known contacts and at least 38 known meetings with Russia-linked operatives.

Shvets, who has carried out his own investigation, said: "For me, the Mueller report was a big disappointment because people expected that it will be a thorough investigation of all ties between Trump and Moscow, when in fact what we got was an investigation of just crime related issues. There were no counterintelligence aspects of the relationship between Trump and Moscow."

He added: "This is what basically we decided to correct. So I did my investigation and then got together with Craig Unger. So we believe that this book will pick up where Mueller left off."

Side note: President Donald Trump has been using the raised "clinched fist" gesture for decades, including during his indictment in April 2023 and during a campaign stop in Detroit. The gesture has been associated with various groups, including fascists, socialists, Communists (Bolsheviks). In the early 20th century, it was associated with socialism, communism, and labor unions. In the 1960s, it became associated with the black power movement, and after the protests in Ferguson and the 2020 murder of George Floyd, it became a potent symbol of Black Lives Matter protesters. It is a symbol that comes straight from Communist Russia! -The Guardian Jan. 29, 2021

Conspiracy Alert!!!



Since Nov. 18th, mysterious drones the size of cars have been appearing in the night skies over New Jersey and New York state. The sightings have caused much concern to the leaders and citizens of both states. They have also given rise to many different conspiracy theories. First, is was D-N.J. congressman Jeff Van Drew that claimed the mysterious drones were coming from an Iranian mother ship sitting off the east coast. "The ship departed from Iran early in November," the congressman said. That would be about the time Donald Trump was elected president. However, the Pentagon denies the claim.

Chris Smith, R- N.J. said during a congressional hearing that a sworm of over a dozen mystery drones followed close behind a 47 ft. Coast Guard boat. Local law enforcement said they saw at least fifty large drones coming off the ocean at Island Beach State Park.

New Jersey mayor speaks out

Another conspiracy which I believe has much more credibility was put forth by Belleville, New Jersey Mayor Michael Melham. "We know the drones are flying in a grid-like pattern. In my opinion, they're looking (sniffing) for something. What might they be looking for? Maybe radioactive material," Melham said on Good Day New York.

According to a Nuclear Regulatory Commission alert, radioactive material went missing on Dec. 2. "it was a shipment. It arrived at its destination. The container was damaged, and was empty," Melham said.

Melham told Good Day. "Information has not been forthcoming, and it's this lack of transparency...that's doing nothing but fueling conspiracy theories online."

When asked about his thoughts on what the drones could be, Melham responded, "I can tell you what it's not. We know for a fact it's not little green men." He added, "the drones were flying in a grid and that they could likely be looking for something. "Maybe that's radioactive material," Melham said.

"And more than likely, it's not a foreign adversary, because they would be able to figure out how to turn off the blinking lights."

"I don't believe they're concerning, I believe they're ours," Melham continued. "I believe they're up there looking and listening over our infrastructure."

Side note: The Navy and other branches of the U.S. military have been experimenting with drone swarms for some time (like **DARPA's OFFensive Swarm-Enabled Tactics**), the budget document offers detailed, in-depth examples of how the department can deploy the swarms in the future.

Drone swarms, for example, could take off from different places, like submarines and planes, and could be equipped in many ways, like carrying bombs, electronic jammers, and military equipment. The document also talks about making "mother ships" to transport and deploy these swarms.
