- 1. **Old Bavarian Schnitzel**: Fried pork schnitzel, glazed with sweet mustard & horseradish, breaded in pretzel crumble, garnished with lemon wedge & fresh herbs. Served with red cabbage and cucumber salad. **Cost:** \$21.12.
- 2. Classic Bavarian Sauerbraten: German pot-roast with two Bavarian semmelknoedel (bread dumplings), served with red cabbage. Cost: \$19.80
- 3. Curry Wurst: Two sliced, char-grilled brats, served on a bed of crispy fries drizzled with our signature curry sauce. Cost: \$15.84

### 2025 Journeys

Our final outgoing journey of 2025 is to **FF Stratford/St Mary's, Canada**. Twelve ambassadors are slated to attend this trip. Karen Scott is Ambassador Coordinator for this journey.

## 2026 Assigned Journeys:

#### Inbound:

April (Tentative month)- FF Connecticut to FF Knoxville

#### **Outbound:**

**Month to be determined** – FF Knoxville to FF Tallahassee, Florida (new assignment).



The Villages club has disbanded, and FFI has instead reassigned us to visit Friendship Force Tallahassee. The Tallahassee club was originally part of a Florida State University group but joined FFI in 2021. Although journeys may vary, their FFI profile indicates that they usually spend one day south of Tallahassee visiting Wakulla Springs at either the St Marks Refuge or Gulf Specimen Lab. Another day may be spent slightly north in South Georgia visiting a Planation home and the beautiful city of Thomasville, Ga. In Tallahassee, ambassadors usually tour the Goodwood Plantation, Mission San Luis, The Grove, and Maclay Gardens.

**November** – FF Knoxville to Southland and Taupo, New Zealand (2 weeks)

The best time to visit New Zealand is during the summer months of December to March. Expect long, bright, sunny days and temperatures between 61°F and 75°F. It's an ideal time to visit the lovely beaches or enjoy the many outdoor activities available, such as hiking and mountain biking.

Taupo, a town near the center of New Zealand's **North Island**, is distinguished by its lakefront setting and outdoor sports ranging from fishing to jet-boating. The vast waters of Lake Taupo, a volcanic caldera, drain into the Huka Falls, dramatic, crystal-blue cascades reachable by hiking and biking trails. Surrounding Taupo are hot springs.

The Southland club is located in the southernmost part of the **South Island**. The Southland region has some unique scenery including beaches on the south coast, typical native bush with waterfalls and a petrified forest on the Catlins Southern Scenic route, wonderful views along the coast in several directions including Stewart Island, (there is the possibility of traveling to Stewart Island).

# A Different Kind of Journey

You never know where Friendship Force journeys will lead.

In April 2023, Irene Ludwig of the FF Denver club joined the Western Colorado FF club on a journey to Knoxville. Irene's husband, Gerry Forney, was supposed to be on the journey, but became too ill to travel. Mike McDonough and I were Irene's home host.

When the journey ended, Irene told us she knew Gerry would love what she experienced, and she hoped she could bring her husband to Knoxville.

In May I received an email from Irene. She and Gerry were going to be in Chicago and were considering visiting East Tennessee and their friends who have a home at Fairfield Glades in Crossville. We invited

them to stay with us and planned an itinerary.

Irene and Gerry flew to Knoxville on a Sunday morning, rented a car and drove to the Museum of Appalachia. We met in the Museum cafe for a delicious lunch and then we drove to the Norris Dam State Park office to see the film about the CCC building the park. We then dropped them off at the Museum and went home. They took it all in and stayed at the MOA until closing time.

Oak Ridge was not on the itinerary when Irene visited in 2023. Both she and Gerry were eager to see the Manhattan project sites. On Monday we took a bus tour which was a first for me and Mike.

The next day, Mike gave an abbreviated downtown Knoxville tour, including a stop at the Blue Plate Special to hear live music. We also visited the East Tennessee History Center and the Sunsphere.

On Wednesday, their final day with us, we visited the Sequoyah Birthplace Museum in Vonore and nearby Ft. Loudon State Park. Mike and I had talked about visiting the Sequoyah Birthplace Museum but had never been there so we were glad to finally see the Museum and Ft. Loudon State Park.

Gerry and Irene knew this was a Friendship Force journey, but not the usual club to club visit. They looked up individual journeys on the FFI website and discovered that individual journey hosts must apply for a journey number, just as individual clubs do.


