The following day this small park was closed because of the fires.

We visited the Napa Olive Oil Manufacturing Company in Helena, enjoyed lunch outdoors overlooking a golf course, visited a Napa art studio and gallery, and tasted wines at a Friendship Force member's ranch where she has a vineyard. On our free day, Mike and I went on a walking tour of Petaluma. The entire group learned about Jack London at the State Historic Park named after him. Our farewell luncheon was held in a Sonoma restaurant.

I think the other ambassadors would agree that despite the significant challenges of Covid, and the Northern California drought and fires, we are glad we took the plunge and traveled to beautiful Wine Country. As one of the ambassadors said, "What we had can only be experienced with Friendship Force."

The San Antonio Planning Committee invites you to read the itinerary below and see when you can join the fun. Please note if reservations and payment are needed for a particular activity.

Friday, Oct. 22—6 p.m. Welcome Dinner at Cherokee Bluff Clubhouse, 1839 Cherokee Bluff Dr., Knoxville. We will have a local band perform at this potluck event. Everyone is welcome to

attend and meet our ambassadors. You do not have to be a host to attend!

Saturday, Oct. 23—Downtown Knoxville Walking Tour given by FFK member Mike McDonough. Lunch on your own. Highlights: Tennessee Woman Suffrage Memorial, Burn Memorial, Market Square, the WDVX Blue Plate Special and the East Tennessee History Center.

Sunday, Oct. 24-Norris Dam and the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). We suggest ambassadors may want to visit the Museum of Appalachia, 2819 Andersonville Highway in Clinton (senior admission is \$15) in the morning since we will meet at the Museum's Café for a *pre-ordered* lunch. After lunch, we will visit the Overlook and learn about Norris Dam and TVA from FFK member Ron Mayer. We'll tour nearby Lenoir Museum, 2121 Norris Freeway, Norris, to see the early artifacts of East Tennessee, and enjoy a jam session at the museum.
