FFK Journey Information for 2022

Six FFK members, along with four members from clubs in Des Moines, Iowa, Huntsville, Alabama, and Lake Hartwell, Georgia, head to Portland, Oregon on July 6. We will be visiting FF Lower Columbia from July 6-11, and experiencing sites such as the Columbia River Gorge, Mount St. Helens, Fort Clapsop and the Lewis and Clark National Park, plus a local winery. The Knoxville participants will talk about the journey at the August General meeting.

Open World – we are still awaiting further information regarding Open World which is planned for October 7-15 of this year. Judges from Uzbekistan will be visiting us. Please contact Betsy Tonkin if you are willing to host or assist with this program.

Australia- Journey #22408, October 10-November 2, now has 12 Ambassadors, 4 from FFK and 8 from clubs in: Huntsville (1), San Antonio (1), Des Moines (3), Greater Atlanta (2), and Central North Carolina (1). Most are planning to go on our offered three-night pre-trip to Sydney prior to visiting two clubs in Queensland.

FFI assigned Journeys for 2023 - Unfortunately, FFI only assigned us one inbound Journey (Western Colorado), a mutual exchange that had been previously arranged between our two clubs. Our 3 top OUTBOUND choices: Sweden, United Kingdom and Canada were extremely popular and not available to us. After communicating with FFI, Leslie received an email from FFI Planning indicating that we would be assigned a club in Mexico (location, not yet divulged). We are awaiting the "It's a match" form for more details.

On June 11, 8 members of FFK volunteered with Operation INASMUCH to pack meals for Ukrainian Refugees in Poland. Ron and Jean Mayer, Gary and Paulette Anderson, Dave Ostermeier, Gail Tyson, Jayne Raparelli and Leslie Badaines all donned hair coverings and gloves to pack over 500 meals that would head to Poland and hopefully, Lviv, Ukraine, which is close to the Polish border. Over 275,000 meals were packed by the many volunteers who participated.

The FFK effort was inspired and spirited by Phyllis Driver who mentioned at the May FFK picnic that her Rotary club was participating in the event. Phyllis and Ely Driver had joined in a Friendship Force Journey to Ukraine several years ago.

Additional information is available for you to complete if you want to. When you sign up you must agree to the FFI Code of Conduct which is available for you to read from FFI.

Journey with Another Club: Spokane



Ever felt like you wouldn't be accepted in a crowd? Not one of "them" because you didn't belong? Well, not with a Friendship Force (FF) club! The Western North Carolina FF took me into their fold as soon as I met a few of them for breakfast in Atlanta on our way to Eastern Washington/Northern Idaho. Actually, it started before that with emails, welcoming me to the group, keeping me informed of what was going on, what flight individuals were taking, etc. While in Washington and Idaho, I had to keep reminding others that I was from Tennessee. They

assumed that we were all from the same club. There was one other

couple from Iowa who had also joined us, but they had been to Asheville and knew many of the members already.

The journey was wonderful! This was a part of the U.S. I had never seen and so different from the west coast of Washington. I had heard that it is dryer (we had rain only one of the six days we were there, and that was simply a sprinkle), there are mountains surrounding us, but Spokane is in the valley, very similar to Knoxville. The mountains were all pines, however, no deciduous trees. It was 10° cooler than normal for this time of year, so most of us were in at least 4 layers of clothes. That didn't stop us from getting out in the nature. There were state parks, city parks, historic towns surrounding Spokane. Wallace, ID, has been declared the Center of the Universe (the mayor said so, and no one has disputed it!) It is also a silver mining town, and we went down into one of the mines to learn about silver mining. Coeur d'Alene is a beautiful resort town on the lake. We took a boat cruise around the lake to see the mansions and cottages.

At Riverside State Park, we learned more from a park ranger about the Ponderosa

pine trees and the resilience of the forest to take care of itself. The views from our hike were spectacular. Downtown Spokane is beautiful with a waterfall running right down the middle of the city. They've done a marvelous job of repurposing their 1974 World's Fair site with a playground for the kids, a carousel, a skatepark/ice rink, and a gondola ride over the falls. An old art deco hotel, the Davenport, is gorgeous, and the Fox Theatre, also art deco, has been completely refurbished and now houses the symphony orchestra.



And as usual with Friendship Force journeys, we had a welcome dinner at a BBQ restaurant, small group dinners with other members, a second home dinner divided between two members, and a potluck farewell dinner with many of their members. Everyone was so welcoming that I felt like I belonged.

And by the way, Spokane is pronounced Spo-Can, not Spo-Cane! You will be corrected every time!
