Guy & Candie Carawan

Special guests Larry Osborne and Candie Carawan will give voice to the place of music in the culture of East Tennessee in keeping with our journey theme of Mountains and Music.

Larry is a singer/songwriter and professor emeritus at Carson Newman University where he taught courses in psychology and peace studies for many years. He has released several albums of original songs as a solo artist and with his songwriting partner, Diane Krause, and the folk ensemble The Emancipators as a means of raising awareness for environmental issues and peace. He has

played with The Emancipators at the WDVX Blue Plate Special, as well as before many other audiences.

Candie has been a life-long civil rights activist, author, and singer with her late husband folk singer/musicologist and activist Guy Carawan. They met in 1960 at the Highlander Folk School, later

known as the Highlander Research and Education Center located since 1972 in nearby New Market, Tennessee. Guy introduced the protest song "We Shall Overcome" to the American Civil Rights Movement.

Guy and Candie devoted their lives to music making, collecting and spreading songs, and documenting cultural expression, with the goal of empowering participants to learn and inspire others in their own communities. Examples of their publications of music and stories include *Voices from the Mountains: Life and Struggle in the Appalachian South, Sing for Freedom: The Story of the Civil Rights Movement Through Its Songs,* and *Ain't You Got a Right to the Tree of Life: The People of John's Island, South Carolina.* Among the dozens of albums Guy recorded solo and with Candie include *Sparkles and*

Shines, Songs of Struggle and Celebration, This Little Light of Mine, and Tree of Life (Arbol de La Vida).

Larry has been a long-time friend of Candie's and of her late husband Guy Carawan and enjoyed singing and playing music with them. We are honored to have them join us for this event!



Eastern Washington/Northern Idaho (Spokane) to Knoxville



September 13-18, the Friendship Force Club of Eastern Washington/Northern Idaho (otherwise known as Spokane) is visiting Knoxville. I had such a great trip there last fall with the Western NC club, and I want to show the beauties of East Tennessee. The committee has established a wonderful itinerary that shows off the many facets of Knoxville and East Tennessee.

International Storytelling Center

Our theme is still Mountains and Music since that is working well. However, some changes will be made as usual. The first day is very different from our normal one. Since the ambassadors are visiting NC first, we needed a way to meet them halfway and hand them off to the Knoxville club. We agreed to do this in Jonesborough, the oldest town in Tennessee. We have reservations for a 2:00 performance at the **International Storytelling Center** with a box lunch provided by Main St. Café. There's lots to see and do in Jonesborough, and this is a great chance for us to see something different. We'll still do our day in the Smokies, downtown, and Norris with a free day in between.

What we need from the rest of the club at this point are hosts, for overnight, dinners, and days. There are 14 people from Spokane coming to NC. There are 4 couples and 6 single ladies. Dates: November 1-8, 2023 (7 nights)

Optional post tour: November 8-10, 2023, to the Mayan ruins of Palenque, and Roberto Barrios National Park (2

nights)

Itinerary November 1-7, 2023, includes:

- Arrive November 1, 2023 (Day of the Dead celebration November 2, 2023)
- Welcome Party
- Tour by boat on Grijalva River
- Travel by van or bus for one night in hotel Casa Mexicana (breakfast included), in order to visit the towns of Chiapa de Corzo and San Cristobal (lunch in San Cristobal included); While in San Cristobal visit Casa Na-Bolom, a museum dedicated to the history and culture of the Lacandon Jungle; and the textile Museum, Centro de textiles del Mundo Maya.
- Visit two National Parks: Lagunas de Montebello and Sumidero Canyon
- Visit San Juan Chamula and Zinacantan, two native villages in the highlands
- Visit museums in Tuxtla such as a craft museum, botanic garden and Miguel Alvarez del Toro Zoo
- Cost: FF Tuxtla-Gutierrez \$300, Plus FFI fee of \$175 (total \$475). Transportation and some meals not included.

Post Tour Option to Palenque Mayan ruins November 8-10

- Transportation by van; 2 nights at Chan-kah Resort Village hotel in the jungle of Palenque; English guide to the Mayan ruins of Palenque; traditional buffet dinner at area restaurant; Museum visit; and visit to two beautiful waterfalls Cascadas Roberto Barrios and Misol Ha.
- Depart for Home November 10, 2023
- Cost \$450


