# **How Can I Travel with Friendship** Force?

Let me count the ways! That's the question most heard from members of Friendship Force. Although it is not a travel club, learning about other cultures and experiencing first-hand the ways of other people is found thru travel. There is a lot of information available on the Friendship Force International website,

https://www.thefriendshipforce.org/. Here's a brief breakdown of the different types of journeys.

The most common way to travel is with your club. Each year Knoxville requests an inbound domestic and international and an outbound domestic and international journey. We learn in February the locations we've been assigned and if anyone is

coming to Knoxville on international journeys for the following year. Domestic journeys may not have as much lead time. To travel with FFK, watch the newsletters and announcements at meetings. If you're interested in going on an outbound journey, you must complete the Ambassador application

There is a \$25 non-refundable application fee to accompany the application (fee will apply toward the cost of the journey if accepted). If you want to host someone in your home for an inbound journey, you must complete the Host application

Larger clubs may have more than one of these journeys each year. And I mention other clubs because you too can travel with any other FF club. How do you know where anyone is going? If you've signed up on FFI's website, bottom of almost every page, you'll receive emails and notices from FFI regarding journeys that are available to you. One is the E-Flyer which is sent to you on a regular basis. You can flip thru that, find a journey that interests you, and submit the application (same as above). These may not have as much lead time as for those we are planning, but you meet Friendship Force members from other clubs in addition to meeting the people overseas. Clubs are required to post their journey 100 days in advance if the maximum number of ambassador places have not been filled. Members from other clubs can then join. The FFK president also receives from time

to time a request from our regional coordinator to recruit for a club's journey. Those are forwarded to all members of FFK for your information.

You may notice in the E-Flyer and on the list of all journeys on the FFI website that not all the journeys are alike. There are Youth Journeys, which are ideal for your grandchildren to experience travel and other cultures. There are Global Journeys, in which the host club offers a specific topic to go in-depth and members from all over the world can join. This was the trip I took last November to Myanmar and Laos. It was titled "The Best of Burma Discovery Tour" and with me were two other Americans, one from Australia and one from New Zealand. It was a small group, and we had to stay in hotels because the Myanmar government does not allow us to stay in private homes. For other global journeys, you may also use hotels because of the locations and sites you are seeing. Many of the journeys advertised early on are global journeys, and the host is gathering ambassadors from around the world.

Another type of journey is the Festival at Sea. FFI has been offering a cruise for FF members to learn more about Friendship Force, how to conduct journeys, how to spread the word, and meet other members. It is NOT your typical journey. Usually done on a trans-Atlantic or trans-Pacific cruise when you have several sea days, the members would meet each day, listen to talks by FFI staff and board members, role-play, try out lots of ice breakers, work on various topics to find ways to accomplish goals, and most of all, tell others on the ship about Friendship Force.

I'm sure there is more that I've left out, but hopefully, I've triggered enough interest that you'll want to start looking at other opportunities, downloading forms, and applying for the host of opportunities to you as a member of the Friendship Force. Travel often and enjoy every step of the way!

## FFK Journey to Australia

(Journey # 20219)

Space is still available for Friendship Force of Knoxville's Journey to Australia. The dates are October 19, 2020 to November 2, 2020.

The Host clubs are North Moreton (about 1 hour north of Brisbane), and The Gold Coast Club (about one hour south of Brisbane). North Moreton has Beautiful beaches, scenic mountains, lakes, rainforest walks, boutique wineries, and kangaroos. North Moreton is just north of Brisbane, the capital of Queensland, Australia. The North Moreton district encompasses the regions of Caboolture, Redcliffe, Pine Rivers and Bribie Island. It is an area rich in culture and history. Enjoy a barbecue on the shores of Pumicestone Passage as the sun sinks down behind the Glasshouse Mountains. Watch the kangaroos as they hop along the beach. Marvel at the calls of the whip birds as you walk through the rainforest. Get close to a koala at the fabulous Australia Zoo, the creation of legendary Crocodile Man, Steve Irwin. A warm sub-tropical climate offers comfortable living throughout the year. The Gold Coast shoreline stretches along the Pacific Ocean, featuring some of the best surfing beaches in Australia. With names like Surfers Paradise, Broadbeach, Palm Beach and Mermaid Beach, visions of glistening white sands, rolling surf and gently swaying palms. The Gold Coast is recognized as the Holiday Capital of Australia. The Gold Coast has a subtropical climate, with an average of 7.5 hours of sunshine every day of the year, and September to February temperatures of 15° to 29°C, (59 to 84 degrees Fahrenheit). The cost of the trip, though not yet finalized, is expected to be \$3400 to \$3600, per person, for the two weeks. This amount includes all transportation, visa and travel insurance. Participation is limited, so if interested, send in your Friendship Force

Ambassador Application, along with an application fee of \$25 made out to Friendship Force Knoxville.
