## Friendship Force International makes changes in charter regarding data protection

Our charter with our parent organization, Friendship Force International (FFI), has been renewed. Because of the current concerns with data protection, the European Union (EU) has passed very detailed rules. As an international organization with many clubs in Europe, FFI has decided to adhere to EU data protection rules in order to be in compliance with EU law. The changes in the renewed charter reflect those rules. The new data protection sections in the charter are quite extensive. Consequently, the Board of FFK has decided it is prudent for us to only collect the data that we absolutely need to operate and to distribute data only as needed. "As needed" does include providing the directory to all club members and an electronic contact/email list to Board members and committee chairs and committee members. However, the new data protection rules seem to question whether FFK should publish birthdays and anniversaries. Consequently, the Board has decided not to collect and publish such information.
